

THE APPLICATION OF AZTEC OIL & GAS  
COMPANY FOR A DUAL COMPLETION.

ORDER NO. MC-1851

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER  
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, Aztec Oil & Gas Company, made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on February 10, 1969, for permission to dually complete its Grenier Well No. 1 located in Unit O of Section 6, Township 31 North, Range 11 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Aztec-Pictured Cliffs Pool and the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool.

Now, on this 24th day of February, 1969, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That waivers of objection have been received from offsetting operators and the waiting period as prescribed by said rule may be dispensed with at this time.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

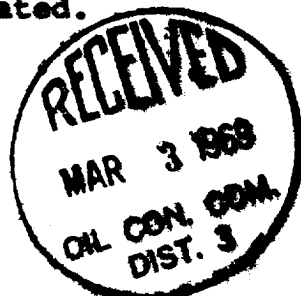
That the applicant herein, Aztec Oil & Gas Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Grenier Well No. 1 located in Unit O of Section 6, Township 31 North, Range 11 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Aztec-Pictured Cliffs Pool and the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool through the casing-tubing annulus and the tubing respectively.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
