This well was drilled as a zero discharge location with no excavation of a pit area for drilling fluids and or cuttings. The cuttings were mechanically separated from the liquid phase of the drilling fluids and semi dried cuttings were stacked on a drying pad to allow for the total evaporation of liquids to evolve from the cuttings. It is estimated that the volume of solids remaining are to +/- 1000 yards.

All drilling fluids were cleaned mechanically of solids and transported to another well site for re-use. The waters were cleaned as well and transported either to another location for re-use or to another well site for re-use.

The well bore penetrated a salt/anhydrite section causing the drilling fluid to saturate to a concentration weight of > 9.5 ppg.

A burial cell is to be excavated and lined with a minimum 12 mil membrane that complies with ASTM Standard(s): D 5747, D 5199, D-5994, and D-4833. The cuttings will be loaded as to allow for > 36" freeboard to ground level. After the cuttings are loaded, the 12 mil liner will be folded over the top. A 20 mil minimum thickness liner

meeting the minimum requirements as outlined in ASTM Standard Methods: D- 5747, D- 5199, D-5994, D-4833; will be used to cap and cover to an extended area that exceeds three feet in all directions from the edge of the burial cell. This cap will be constructed as to slope and allow for water runoff from burial cell.

A minimum of 36" of top soil will be used to cover the burial cell. This soil must be capable of supporting native plant growth. A seed mixture will be used as to conform to local BLM as well as New Mexico OCD requirements. The seeding and propagation of required native plants will be monitored as to insure that growth is reestablished.

After the drilled solids are buried, the natural contour of the surrounding soils will be mechanically shaped as prevent erosion of the well site until vegetation is established.

The caliches and soils will be pulled from the well site pad to allow for a 200 X 300 pad dimension for production use. The remaining materials will be used to maintain lease roads and other drill sites
