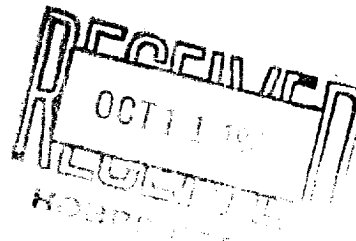

DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

Bridging plug at 10666 ft. Attempted to acidize with 1000 gals., Western Co. thru 30 jet perforations 10626-10636 ft. Formation refused to break at 2900 psi tubing and 2800 casing. Packer at 10584 ft. Held for 2 hrs. 40 mins. at those pressures, casing valve closed.

Type B McCullough bridging plug set at 9805 ft. Jet perforated with 24 holes from 9748-82 ft. by McCullough Tool Co. Ran 2 1/2" tubing with packer at 9711 ft., then, swabbed dry. Western Co. attempted to acidize with 500 gals. but formation refused to break at 2900 psi on tubing and 2800 psi on the annulus. Reperforated same zone and now swabbing salt water showing slight gas.
