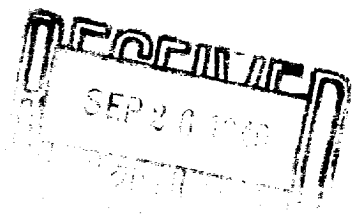

After waiting forty-eight hours, the casing was tested with 1000# pressure applied for 30 minutes. The plug was drilled and the casing and cement were tested with 1000# pressure applied for 30 minutes. Both tests were OK, and after approval of Mr. Yarbrough, State Oil & Gas Inspector, preparations were made to drill ahead.

Top of cement back of 9 5/8" casing @ 1710' per temperature survey.
