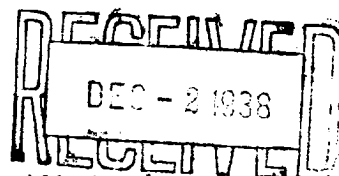

DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

The 8 5/8" casing was set at 3303', 500' below the salt section. The pipe was cemented with Halliburton using a two stage cement job. - 200 sacks from bottom of salt to total depth, 3315' and 750 sacks from surface to top of salt, 3165'. The cement was left to set forty eight hours and tested according to rules and regulations, by building up a pressure of 1000' and leaving set 30 minutes.
