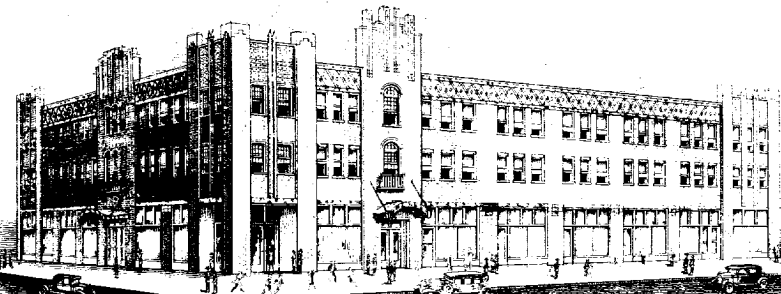

If these papers are not in proper form, or if there is any further information you desire, kindly so advise, and we will endeavor to comply with your wishes in the matter.

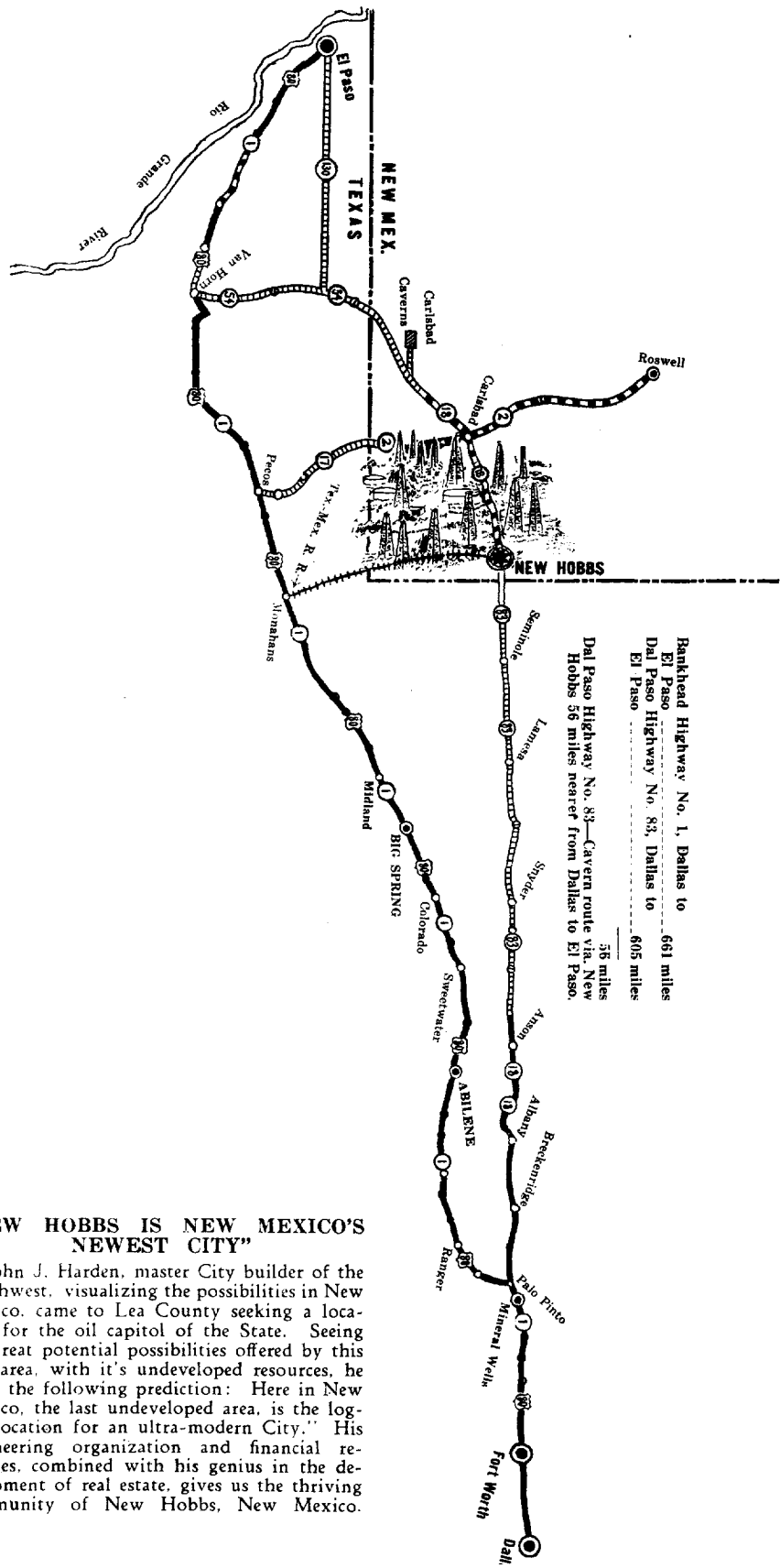
