Gentlemen:

The captioned well is due to cease delivery to a temporary casinghead sale on August 1, 1977. An FPC filing is now in progress toward approval for the gas to be transported by EPNG to Southern Union's market area on a permanent basis, however, approval is not expected prior to October 1, 1977. For this reason, we are requesting exception to no-flare rule 306.

The well is declining in production as noted by previous monthly production. May production averaged 50 bbls/day. June production averaged 27 bbls/day. Due to this unsteady production pattern, we had Testers, Inc. of Hobbs run a recent G.O.R. test. Results indicated 23.5 bbls/day with a G.O.R. of 2035 ft3/bbl. This equates to 48 MCF/day.

Negotiations are ongoing in an attempt to effect an additional temporary sale prior to F.P.C. approval. In the event we are successful the no-flare exception application we are hereby submitting well be cancelled.
