DETAILS OF WORK

On August 10, 1951, while at a depth of 3695' in line, drilling contractor attempted to run caliper survey in subject well, but was unable to reach bottom. Drill pipe with bit was run and bridge at approximately 900' was being drilled when the well blew out and caught on fire. It is estimated that approximately 600 MCF gas was consumed during this fire which lasted about eight hours. No oil was being produced at the time. There were no personal injuries in connection with this fire. The drilling contractor's rig was badly damaged and was replaced with another rig. Drilling of bridge at 920' was resumed and resulted in side-tracking old hole. Drilling operations are now in progress in new hole at depth of 3420'.

I understand that this plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.
