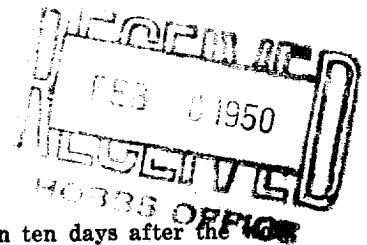

DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

Formation first took acid at 1350 pounds but by time 5000 gallons were injected at the rate of twelve barrels per minute, pressure broke down to zero. 7" casing was perforated from 3580 to 3600 and from 3615 to 3640 in order to acidise.
