Report of the Commission

WOMEN'S ECONOMIC PARTICIPATION

The Commission has been pleased to receive the report of the Working Group on Women's Economic Participation, which was established in 1975. The report, which is being presented to the Commission today, contains a comprehensive analysis of the current situation of women in the world's economies and makes a number of important recommendations for their improvement.

The report is divided into two main parts.
