APPLICATION

Caza Petroleum, LLC applies for an order pooling all mineral interests in the Wolfcamp formation underlying a horizontal spacing unit comprised of the W/2E/2 of Section 17 and the W/2SE/4 of Section 8, Township 20 South, Range 35 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico, and in support thereof, states:

- 1. Applicant is an interest owner in the W/2E/2 of Section 17 and the W/2SE/4 of Section 8 and has the right to drill a well or wells thereon.
- 2. Applicant proposes to drill the Desert Rose 17-8 Federal Com. Well No. 15H to a depth sufficient to test the Wolfcamp, with first take points in the SW/4SE/4 of Section 17 and last take points in the NW/4SE/4 of Section 8.
- 3. Applicant in good faith has sought to obtain the voluntary joinder of all other mineral interest owners in the Wolfcamp formation in the W/2E/2 of Section 17 and the W/2SE/4 of Section 8 for the purposes set forth herein.
- 4. Although applicant attempted to obtain voluntary agreements from all mineral interest owners to participate in the drilling of the wells or to otherwise commit their interests to the wells, certain interest owners have failed or refused to join in dedicating their interests. Therefore, applicant seeks an order pooling all mineral interest owners in the Wolfcamp formation underlying a horizontal spacing unit comprised of the W/2E/2 of Section 17 and the W/2SE/4 of Section 8, pursuant to NMSA 1978 §70-2-17.

EXHIBIT

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5. The pooling of all mineral interests in the Wolfcamp formation underlying the described

portions of Section 17 and Section 8 will prevent the drilling of unnecessary wells, prevent waste,

and protect correlative rights.

WHEREFORE, applicant requests that, after notice and hearing, the Division enter its

order:

A. Pooling all mineral interests in the Wolfcamp formation underlying those portions of

Section 17 and Section 8 described herein;

B. Designating Caza Operating, LLC as operator of the wells;

C. Considering the cost of drilling, completing, and equipping the ells and allocating the cost

thereof among the wells' working interest owners;

D. Approving actual operating charges and costs charged for supervision, together with a

provision adjusting the rates pursuant to the COPAS accounting procedure; and

E. Setting a 200% charge for the risk involved in drilling, completing, and equipping the wells

in the event a working interest owner elects not to participate in the wells.

SELF-AFFIRMED STATEMENT OF DAVID GIBSON

David Gibson states the following:

- 1. I am a landman for Caza Petroleum, LLC ("Caza"). I have been qualified by the Division as an expert petroleum landman
- 2. Pursuant to the Division's Rules, the following information is submitted in support of the compulsory pooling application filed herein:
 - (a) The purpose of this application is to force pool working interest owners into the Wolfcamp horizontal spacing unit described below, and in the wells, to be drilled in that unit.
 - (b) No opposition is expected because the interest owners being pooled have been contacted regarding the proposed wells but to date have filed or refused to voluntarily commit their interests to the wells.
 - (c) The following are attached hereto:
 - 1. Attachment A Form C-102 for the Desert Rose 17-8 Federal Com #15H.

They show the outline of the unit being pooled. Caza seeks an order pooling all mineral interests in the Wolfcamp formation underlying a horizontal spacing unit comprised of the W2E2 of Section 17 and the W2SE4 of Section 8, T20S, R35E, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico. The unit will be dedicated to the Desert Rose 17-8 Federal Com #15H with a first take point in the SW/4SE/4 of Section 17, T20S R35E and a final take point in the NW4SE4 of Section 8, T20S R35E, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico.

- (d) There is a depth severance in the Wolfcamp formation in the proposed pooled spacing unit. It is defined in the Farmout Agreement dated March 1, 2016 between SDX Resources, Inc. and HOG Partnership LP as those depths from the surface to the top of the Wolfcamp Carbonate formation at 11,620' or the stratigraphic equivalent as shown on that specific log of the Jake L Hamon NE Lynch Unit-Federal 1Well (API #30-025-20377), now known as the Appleseed Federal Com #1.
- (e) Attachment B shows the parties being pooled and the best estimate of their respective interests at this time pending a final title opinion.
- (f) Attachment C is a copy of the proposal letter sent to the working interest owners for the well. Their current and correct addresses are set forth therein. Caza has searched public records and internet records to determine these addresses. None of the letters sent to the interest owners have

been returned as undeliverable. In addition to this letter, I have participated in phone calls and e-mails with the interest owners regarding the proposed wells, and Caza is still negotiating with these owners to obtain final signed documents regarding these interests.

- (g) Caza has made a good faith effort to locate all interest owners and to obtain the voluntary joinder of the working interest owners in the proposed wells.
- (h) Caza has the right to pool the overriding royalty owners in the well unit.
- (i) Attachment D contains the Authorization for Expenditure for the well. The estimated cost of the well set forth therein is fair and reasonable and comparable to the cost of other wells of similar depth and length drilled in this area of Lea County.
- (j) Caza requests overhead and administrative rates of \$7500/month for a drilling well and \$750/month for a producing well. These rates are fair, and comparable to the rates charged by other operators for wells of this type in this portion of Lea County. They are also the rates set forth in the Joint Operating Agreement for the well unit. Caza requests that these rates be adjusted periodically as provided in the COPAS Accounting Procedure.
- (k) Caza requests that the maximum cost plus 200% risk charge be assessed against non-consenting working interest owners.
- (l) Caza requests that Caza Operating, LLC be designated operator of the wells.
- (m) The attachments to this affidavit were prepared by me or compiled from company business records.
- (n) The granting of this application 1s in the interests of conservation and the prevention of waste.

I understand that this Self-Affirmed Statement will be used as written testimony in this case. I affirm that my testimony in paragraphs 1 through 2(n) above is true and correct and is made under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of New Mexico. 

Caza Petroleum, LLC ("Caza") hereby proposes to drill the referenced nine wells from three well pads located as follows:

Pad #1: SE/4SW/4 of Section 17; Desert Rose 17-8 Federal Com #11H (3rd Bone Spring), #13H (2nd Bone Spring), and #14H (Wolfcamp Z)

Pad #2: SW/4SE/4 of Section 17; Desert Rose 17-8 Federal Com #5H (2^{nd} Bone Spring), #7H (3^{rd} Bone Spring), and #15H (Wolfcamp Z)

Pad #3: SE/4SE/4 of Section 17; Desert Rose 17-8 Federal Com #8H (3^{rd} Bone Spring), #10H (2^{nd} Bone Spring), and #16H (Wolfcamp Z)

The surface locations, bottom hole locations, total vertical depths, total measured depths, and formation targets are shown in the attached Authorities for Expenditures for each well. SELF-AFFIRMED STATEMENT OF RICHARD CARROLL

Richard Carroll states the following:

- 1. I am a geologist for Caza Petroleum, LLC ("Caza). I have been qualified by the Division as an expert petroleum geologist.
- 2. The following documents are attached hereto and submitted in support of the compulsory pooling application filed herein:
 - (a) Attachment A is a locator and structure map of the Wolfcamp Sand showing Caza's acreage in this area and the locations of the proposed Bone Spring wells. It shows the structure dips gently up to the north. It also shows a line of cross-section.
 - (b) Attachment B is an isopach of the Wolfcamp Sand, which shows the Wolfcamp thickens to the west across the well units.
 - (c) Attachment C is a north-to-south structural cross section of the Wolfcamp Sand. The well logs on the cross-section give a representative sample of the Bone Spring formation in this area. The target zone for the well is the Wolfcamp Sand.
- 3. I conclude from the documents that:
 - (a) The horizontal spacing units are justified from a geologic standpoint.
 - (b) The target Wolfcamp zone is continuous across the well units.
 - (c) Each quarter section in the units will contribute more or less equally to production from the wells.
 - (d) There is no faulting or other geologic impediment which will affect the drilling of the subject wells.
- 4. Other Bone Spring wells drilled in this area are drilled with both standup and laydown units. Caza sees no difference in production whether wells are standup or laydown.
- 5. Attachments F is the horizontal well plan for the Desert Rose 17-8 Federal Com #15H. The producing interval of each well will be orthodox.
