AFFIDAVIT OF DON JOHNSON

Don Johnson, being duly sworn, deposes and states as follows:

- 1. I am over the age of 18, I am a landman for Franklin Mountain Energy 3, LLC ("Franklin"), and I have personal knowledge of the matters stated herein. I have previously testified before the Oil Conservation Division ("Division") and my credentials as an expert petroleum landman were accepted by the Division as a matter of record.
- My area of responsibility at Franklin includes the area of Lea County in New Mexico.
- I am familiar with the application filed by Franklin in this case, which is attached as Exhibit B.1.
 - 4. I am familiar with the status of the lands that are subject to the application.
- 5. I submit the following information pursuant to NMAC 19.15.4.12.A(1) in support of the above referenced compulsory pooling application.
- 6. The purpose of the application is to force pool all uncommitted interests into the horizontal spacing unit described below, and in the wells to be drilled in the unit.

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7. No opposition is expected because the interest owners being pooled have been contacted regarding the proposed wells, but have failed or refused to voluntarily commit their

interests in the wells.

8. In this case, Franklin seeks an order from the Division pooling all uncommitted

mineral interests within a 639.21-acre, more or less, Wolfcamp horizontal spacing unit comprised

of Lots 1 and 2, S/2 NE/4, SE/4 of irregular Section 3 (E/2 equivalent), and the E/2 of Section 10,

Township 19 South, Range 35 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico.

9. This spacing unit will be dedicated to the Eagle State Com 704H well to be

horizontally drilled from a surface hole location in the NW/4 NE/4 (Lot 2) of Section 3 to a bottom

hole location in the SW/4 SE/4 (Unit O) of Section 10; and the **Eagle State Com 705H** well to be

horizontally drilled from a surface hole location in the NE/4 NE/4 (Lot 1) of Section 3 to a bottom

hole location in the SE/4 SE/4 (Unit P) of Section 10.

10. Attached as **Exhibit B.2** are the proposed C-102s for the wells.

11. The C-102s identify the proposed surface hole locations and the bottom hole

locations, and the first take points. The C-102 also identify the pool and pool code.

12. The well will develop the Scharb; Wolfcamp Pool (Code 55640).

13. The Scharb; Wolfcamp Pool is an oil pool with 40-acre building blocks.

14. The pool is governed by the state-wide horizontal well rules.

15. The producing area for the wells are expected to be orthodox.

16. There are no depth severances within the proposed spacing unit.

17. The completed interval for the Eagle State Com 704H well is expected to be less

than 330 feet from the adjoining tracts thereby allowing for the inclusion of the proximity tracts

within the proposed spacing unit under the Division's rules.

- 18. **Exhibit B.3** includes a lease tract map outlining the unit being pooled. Exhibit B.3 also includes the parties being pooled, the nature, and the percent of their interests.
- 19. I have conducted a diligent search of the public records in the county where the wells are located, and conducted phone directory and computer searches to locate contact information for parties entitled to notification, and mailed the working interest owners well proposals, including the Authorizations for Expenditure.
- 20. In my opinion, Franklin has made a good faith effort to obtain voluntary joinder of the working interest owners in the proposed wells.
 - 21. **Exhibit B.4** is a summary of my contacts with the working interest owners.
 - 22. **Exhibit B.5** is a list of the parties being pooled for this case.
- 23. **Exhibit B.6** is a sample of the well proposal letter that was sent to all working interest owners. The proposal letter identifies the proposed surface hole and bottom hole locations and approximate TVD/MD for the wells.
- 24. **Exhibit B.7** contains the Authorization for Expenditure for the proposed wells. The estimated cost of the well set forth therein is fair and reasonable, and is comparable to the costs of other wells of similar depths and length drilled in this area of New Mexico.
- 25. Franklin requests overhead and administrative rates of \$9,000 month for drilling the well and \$900 month for the producing well. These rates are fair, and comparable to the rates charged by other operators for wells of this type in this area of Southeastern, New Mexico. Franklin requests that these rates be adjusted periodically as provided in the COPAS Accounting Procedure.
- 26. Franklin requests the maximum cost plus 200% risk charge be assessed against nonconsenting working interest owners.
 - 27. Franklin requests that it be designated operator of the wells.

- 28. The parties Franklin is seeking to pool were notified of this hearing.
- 29. Franklin seeks to pool overriding royalty interest owners, and they were also provided notice of this hearing.
- 30. The attachments to this affidavit were prepared by me, or compiled from company business records, or were prepared at my direction.
- 31. In my opinion, the granting of this application is in the interests of conservation and the prevention of waste.

Franklin Mountain Energy 3, LLC ("Franklin"), OGRID Number 331595, through its undersigned attorneys, hereby files this application with the Oil Conservation Division ("Division") pursuant to the provisions of NMSA 1978, § 70-2-17, for an order pooling all uncommitted mineral interests within a 639.21-acre, more or less, Wolfcamp horizontal spacing unit comprised of Lots 1 and 2, S/2 NE/4, SE/4 of irregular Section 3 (E/2 equivalent), and the E/2 of Section 10, Township 19 South, Range 35 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico. In support of this application, Franklin states as follows:

- 1. Franklin has an interest in the subject lands and has a right to drill and operate wells thereon.
 - 2. Franklin seeks to dedicate the spacing unit to the following wells:
 - a. **Eagle State Com 704H** well to be horizontally drilled from a surface hole location in the NW/4 NE/4 (Lot 2) of Section 3 to a bottom hole location in the SW/4 SE/4 (Unit O) of Section 10; and
 - b. Eagle State Com 705H well to be horizontally drilled from a surface hole location in the NE/4 NE/4 (Lot 1) of Section 3 to a bottom hole location in the SE/4 SE/4 (Unit P) of Section 10.
 - 3. The producing area for the wells is expected to be orthodox.

- 4. The completed interval for the **Eagle State Com 704H** well is expected to be less than 330 feet from the adjoining tracts thereby allowing for the inclusion of the proximity tracts within the proposed spacing unit under Rule 19.15.16.15(B)(1)(b) NMAC.
- 5. Franklin sought, but has been unable to obtain, a voluntary agreement from all interest owners in the Wolfcamp formation underlying the proposed spacing unit to participate in the drilling of the wells or to otherwise commit their interests to the wells.
- 6. The pooling of all interests in the Wolfcamp formation underlying the proposed unit will prevent the drilling of unnecessary wells, prevent waste and protect correlative rights.

WHEREFORE, Franklin requests this application be set for hearing before an Examiner of the Oil Conservation Division on May 2, 2024 and after notice and hearing as required by law, the Division enter its order:

- A. Pooling all uncommitted interests in the Wolfcamp formation underlying a horizontal spacing unit within Lots 1 and 2, S/2 NE/4, SE/4 of irregular Section 3 (E/2 equivalent), and the E/2 of Section 10, Township 19 South, Range 35 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico;
 - B. Designating Franklin as operator of this unit and the wells to be drilled thereon;
- C. Authorizing Franklin to recover its costs of drilling, equipping and completing the wells;
- D. Approving actual operating charges and costs charged for supervision, together with a provision adjusting the rates pursuant to the COPAS accounting procedure; and
- E. Setting a 200% charge for the risk involved in drilling and completing the wells in the event a working interest owner elects not to participate in the wells.

- Franklin retained a broker who conducted extensive title work to determine the working interest owners and other interest owners.
- Franklin searched public records, phone directory, and various different types of internet searches.
- Franklin sent well proposal letters to the working interest owners on or around February 20, 2024.
- Franklin proposed general terms of a Joint Operating Agreements (JOA) within the well proposal letters sent to working interest owners.
- Franklin had multiple communications with the uncommitted owners, which I have outlined in the chart below.
- Franklin filed the application to force pool unleased mineral interest owners who had not entered in to an agreement.
- Franklin's counsel sent notices of the force pooling applications to the addresses of record for the uncommitted interest owners and also for overriding royalty interest owners.
- Franklin also published notice in a newspaper of general circulation in the county where the wells will be located.

AFFIDAVIT OF BEN KESSEL

Ben Kessel, being duly sworn, deposes and states as follows:

- 1. I am over the age of 18, I am a geologist for Franklin Mountain Energy 3, LLC ("Franklin"), and have personal knowledge of the matters stated herein. I have previously testified before the Oil Conservation Division ("Division") and my credentials as an expert petroleum geologist were accepted by the Division as a matter of record.
- My area of responsibility at Franklin includes the area of Lea County in New Mexico.
 - 3. I am familiar with the application filed by Franklin in this case.
- 4. **Exhibit C.1** is a locator map showing the approximate location of the proposed unit in relation to the Capitan Reef.
 - 5. **Exhibit C.2** is a wellbore schematic showing Franklin's development plan.
- 6. **Exhibit C.3** through **Exhibit C.6** are the geology study I prepared for the Eagle State Com 704H and Eagle State Com 705H wells, which will target the Wolfcamp A.
- 7. **Exhibit C.3** is a structure map of the Wolfcamp A formation. The proposed spacing unit is identified by a green box. The Eagle State Com 704H and Eagle State Com 705H wells



proposed in this case are identified by the black-dashed line. The contour interval used in this exhibit is 25 feet. This exhibit shows that the structure dips gently to the southwest.

- 8. **Exhibit C.4** is a cross-section reference map that identifies five wells in the vicinity of the proposed Eagle State Com 704H and Eagle State Com 705H wells, shown by a line of cross-section running from A to A'.
- 9. **Exhibit C.5** is a stratigraphic cross-section, and the well logs shown on the cross-section give a representative sample of the Wolfcamp A formation in the area. The target zone is identified by a bracket and the words "Producing Interval." I have also identified where the proposed well falls within the wells I used for the cross-section.
- 10. **Exhibit C.6** an Isochore map of the Wolfcamp A formation. The gross interval thickness increases slightly to the west.
 - 11. I conclude from the geology studies referenced above that:
 - The horizontal spacing unit is justified from a geologic standpoint.
 - There are no structural impediments or faulting that will interfere with horizontal development.
 - Each quarter-quarter section in the proposed unit will contribute more or less equally to production.
- Exhibit C.7 provides an overview of the stress orientation in the area based on the
 Snee-Zoback paper.
- 13. The preferred well orientation in this area is either north/south or south/north, nearly orthogonal to S_{Hmax} , optimal for inducted fracture propagation. This is because the S_{Hmax} is at approximately 255 degrees ENE in this area of Lea County.

- 14. In my opinion, the granting of Franklin's application is in the interests of conservation and the prevention of waste.
- 15. The attachments to this affidavit were prepared by me, or compiled from company business records, or were prepared at my direction.

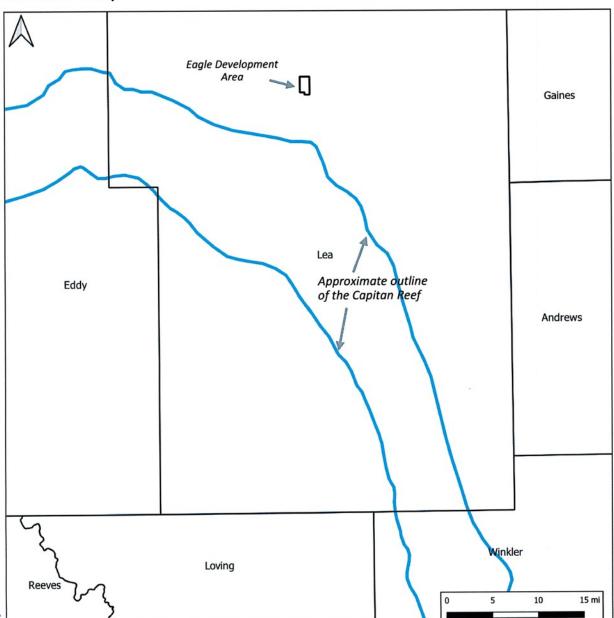

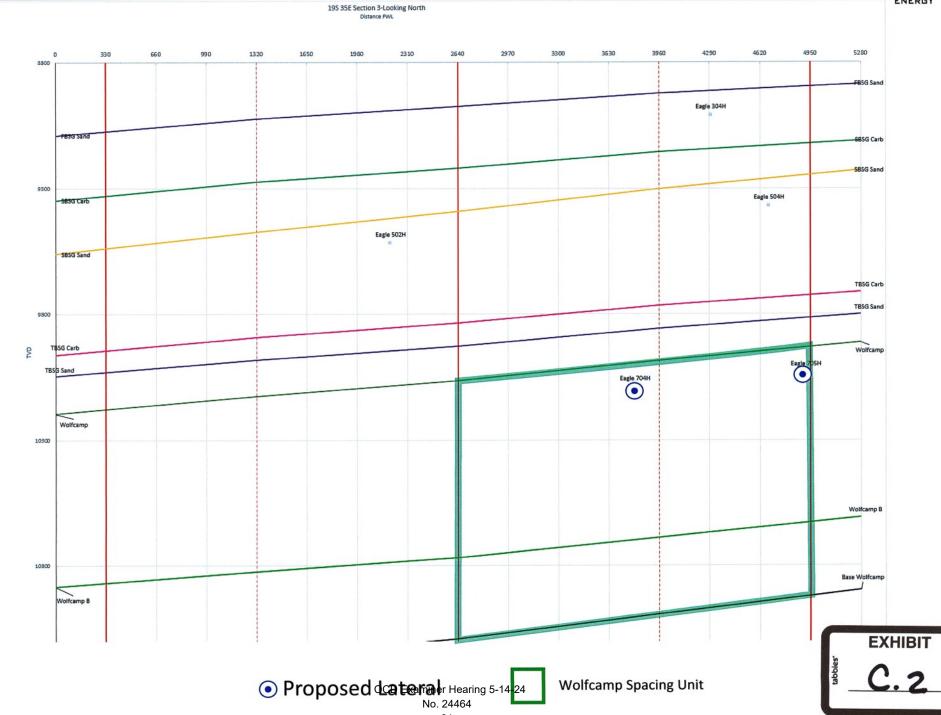
Locator Map

- Planned wells are located outside of the eastern edge of the Capitan Reef



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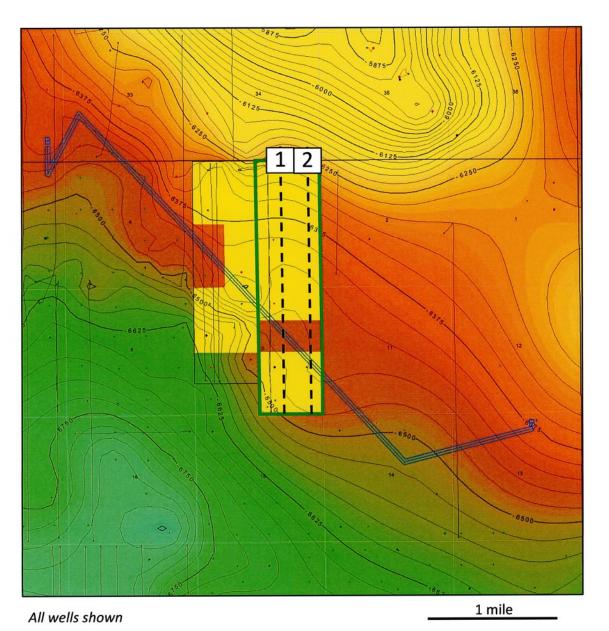


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Wolfcamp Structure Map

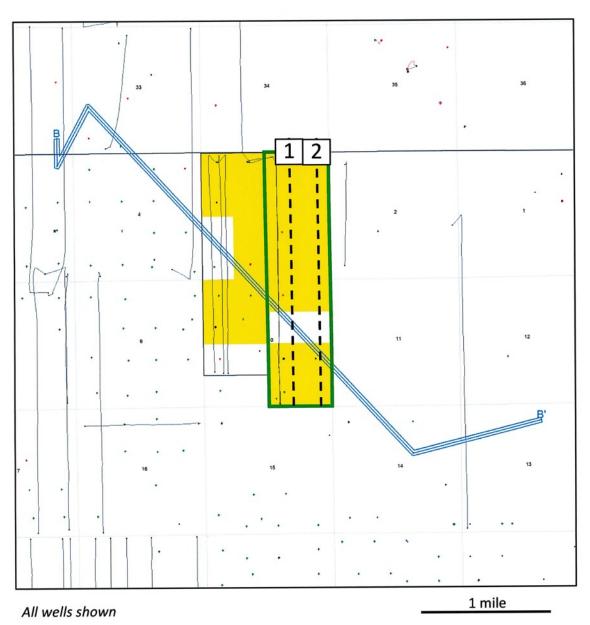

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Eross Section Reference Map



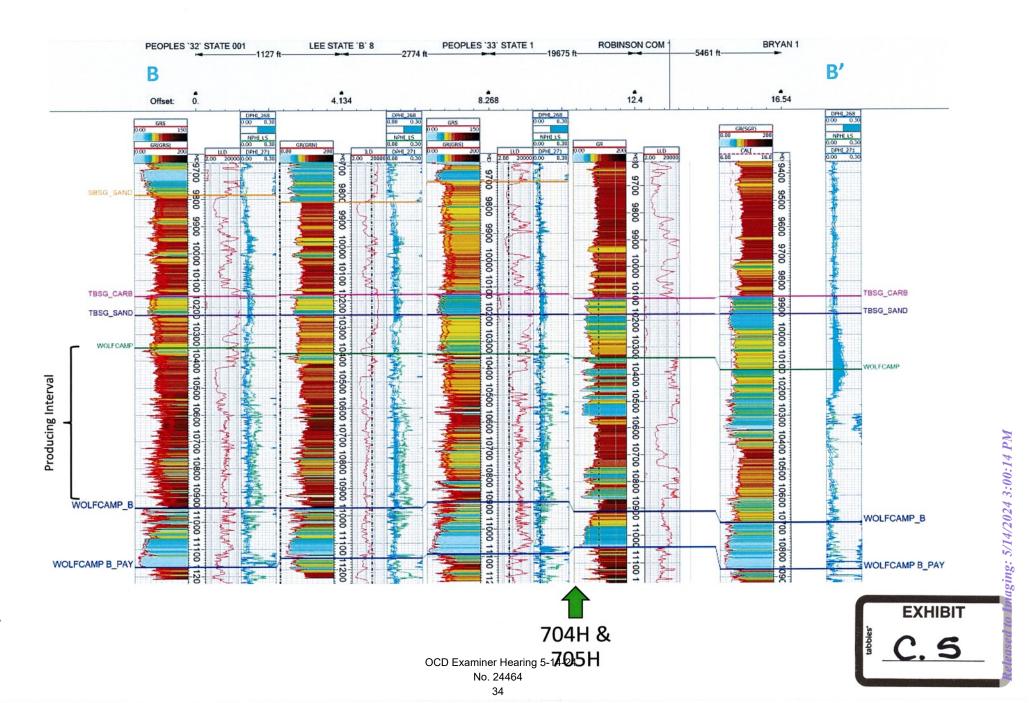

Wolfcamp A Cross Section

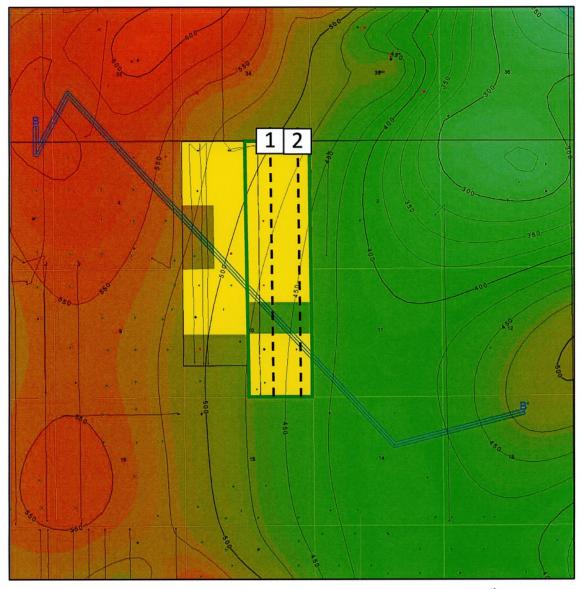




Wolfcamp Isochore Map
