APPLICATION

Mewbourne Oil Company ("Mewbourne" or "Applicant") (OGRID No. 14744), through its undersigned attorneys, hereby files this application with the Oil Conservation Division pursuant to the provisions of NMSA 1978, § 70-2-17, for an order pooling all uncommitted mineral owners in a standard 240-acre, more or less, well spacing unit in the Bone Spring formation underlying the E/2 SE/4 of Section 18 and E/2 E/2 of Section 19, Township 18 South, Range 34 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico. In support of its application, Mewbourne states:

- 1. Applicant is a working interest owner in the proposed spacing unit and has the right to drill thereon.
- 2. Mewbourne seeks to dedicate the above-referenced spacing unit to the proposed **Macho Man 18/19 Federal Com 528H** (API No. 30-025-54734) well, to be drilled from a surface hole location in the SW/4 NE/4 (Unit G) of Section 18, to a bottom hole location in SE/4 SE/4 (Unit P) of Section 19.
- 3. Applicant has sought and been unable to obtain voluntary agreement for the development of these lands from all mineral interest owners in the subject spacing unit.
- 4. The pooling of interests will avoid the drilling of unnecessary wells, will prevent waste, and will protect correlative rights.

WHEREFORE, Applicant requests that this matter be set for hearing before an Examiner of the Oil Conservation Division on December 4, 2025, and, after notice and hearing as required by law, the Division enter an order:

- A. Pooling all uncommitted interest owners in the horizontal spacing unit;
- B. Designating Applicant as operator of this spacing unit and the horizontal well to be drilled thereon;
- C. Authorizing Applicant to recover its costs of drilling, completing, and equipping the well;
- D. Approving the actual operating charges and costs of supervision while drilling and after completion, together with a provision adjusting the rates pursuant to the COPAS accounting procedures; and
- E. Imposing a 200% charge for the risk assumed by Applicant in drilling and completing the well against any working interest owner who does not voluntarily participate in the drilling of the well.
