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MR. NUTTER: Call next Case Number 6599. MR. PADILLA: Application of Gulf Oil Corporation for downhole commingling, Lea County, New Mexico. MR. CROSS: Terry Cross for Gulf Oil Corporation, and Mr. Sperling has also entered an appearance in this case. MR. NUTTER: We have that appearance. MR. CROSS: Do you consider this witness still under oath? The witness is still under MR. NUTTER: oath. BETHEL S. STRAWSER

being called as a witness and having been previously sworn upon her oath, testified as follows, to-wit:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. CROSS:

Would you please state your name, your 0. employer, and your position, for the record, please? Once again, my name is Bethel Strawser, A. with Gulf Oil Corporation as a petroleum engineer in Midland, Texas. MR. CROSS: In view of the fact that this witness just qualified in the preceding case, is she qualified now?

MR. NUTTER: The witness is qualified.

Q Would you please state what Gulf is seeking in this application?

A. Gulf is seeking authority to downhole commingle production from the North Justis-Montoya Pool and the North Justis-Fusselman Pool in the wellbore of our W. A. Ramsey NCT-C Well No. 4, which is located in Unit M, Section 36, Township 24 South, Range 37 East, in Lea County, New Mexico.

Q Would you please explain your Exhibit
Number One?

A Exhibit Number One is a plat of the area.

It shows the W. A. Ramsey Lease outlined by a dashed line.

The Well No. 4 has been colored red.

Q. Do you have an exhibit showing the downhole particulars of this well?

A. Yes. Exhibit Number Two is a diagrammatic sketch showing the details of the completion and the down-hole equipment both presently in use and proposed for use after authority to commingle has been granted.

Q. Would you please give the history of this well?

A. Well history as per Exhibit -
MR. NUTTER: And you're reading from Ex-

hibit Three, right?

A As per Exhibit Three, yes.

MR. NUTTER: I think you don't have to read the whole thing, just summarize it, since you do have it on record here as an exhibit.

A. Okay. The well was spudded in 1962.

Total depth is 8155 feet with 7-inch production casing at that depth.

It was originally triplely completed with North Justis-Fusselman, North Justis-Montoya, and North Justi -Waddell under the Order Number R-2430.

Waddell has since been temporarily abandoned and we are now dually completed between the Montoya and the Fusselman.

Montoya zone is perforated 7104 to 14 and was treated with acid, squeeezed and re-perforated and treated again with acid. It initially flowed 188 barrels of oil per day.

Fusselman was perforated 6988 to 6996 and treated with acid. Its initial production was 166 barrels of oil per day.

The most recent C-116s are Exhibits Number Four-A and Four-B.

Q. Do you have exhibits setting out the production performance of this well?

A Yes, the Exhibits Five-A and Five-B plot the average daily production on an annual basis and the last one-and-a-half years on a monthly basis.

These curves show the production between the two zones is fairly equivalent at the present time. The latest averages that I have show the Fusselman zone pumping 12 barrels of oil and 90 barrels of water per day, with 3 Mcf of gas, while the Montoya zone pumps 10 barrels of oil, 20 barrels of water, and 3 Mcf gas.

Exhibits Six-A and Six-B tabulate the same data in numerical form.

Q Have precedents been set in the immediate area to downhole commingle the North Justis-Fusselman and North Justis-Montoya Pools?

A Yes. Under Order Number R-4895, dated

October 29th, 1974, Texaco was granted authority to downhole commingle production from the two subject pools, together with the North Justis-Ellenburger Pool in their

G. L. Erwin "B" Federal NCT-2 Well No. 5. This is located
in Unit P of Section 35, Township 24 South, Range 37 East.

This well offsets the Gulf W. A. Ramsey

NCT-C Well No. 4 to the west, and I have marked it in yellow

on your Exhibit Number One plat.

Q. What problems have been encountered as a result of dual completion in this well?

A. We have experienced corrosion problems in this well. Historically, tubing leaks and packer failures have been a problem. Protection against this corrosion, however, is very difficult to accomplish with the dual equipment in the wellbore. A single string of tubing would facilitate the circulation which is required to effectively apply corrosion treatment chemicals. We believe that it is no longer feasible to effectively produce the well as a dual.

Q Do you anticipate any crossflow problems as a result of commingling?

A. No crossflow problems are anticipated.

We do expect to keep the well pumped off.

Q. Are you currently surface commingling Montoya and Fusselman production on the subject lease?

A. Yes. Production from the North Justis-Fusselman and the North Justis-Montoya is being commingled in surface storage facilities under administrative order PC-72.

We have seen no evidence of fluid incompatibility to date and we do not anticipate any future problems.

Q. Will the value of the production from this well be adversely affected as a result of downhole commingling?

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- Q How does Gulf propose to allocate production between the Montoya and Fusselman Pools?
- A Based on recent C-116s, we propose to allocate 50 percent of the oil and 50 percent of the gas to each zone, with 90 percent of the water allocated to the Montoya and 10 percent of the water to the Fusselman.

We suggest that details on this matter be worked out with the District Director of the New Mexico
Oil Conservation Division, together with Gulf personnel after authority to downhole commingle has been granted.

- Q What does Gulf propose in the event secondary recovery operations are undertaken in this area in these pools?
- A. We will recommend separation of the zones as deemed necessary for efficient secondary recovery operations.
- Q. What do you anticipate regarding the production capabilities of this well under commingled conditions?
- A. We do expect to slightly increase the efficiency of artificial lift operations as a result of down-

hole commingling. This may slightly increase the total production from both zones, however, we anticipate that combined production in the near future will not exceed 25 barrels of oil, 10 Mcf gas, and 120 barrels of water per day.

Q Would you again please summarize what Gulf is seeking in this application?

Mum oil recovery in the most efficient and feasible manner, we request authority to downhole commingle the North Justis-Fusselman and the North Justis-Montoya production in our W. A. Ramsey NCT-C Well No. 4, located in Unit M, Section 36, Township 24 South, Range 37 East, Lea County, New Mexico.

Q. Were Exhibits One through Six-B prepared under your supervision?

A. Yes, they were.

MR. CROSS: I move they be admitted into evidence.

MR. NUTTER: Gulf Exhibits One through Six will be admitted in evidence.

MR. CROSS: I have no further questions.

CROSS EXAMINATION

BY MR. NUTTER:

Q. Ms. Strawser, inspection of Exhibit Number Five-A would indicate there was a temporary increase in gas production from both zones in 1972 and '73; then it went back to a comparatively low level, and also that there was a temporary increase in the amount of water that was produced from the Montoya just for a period of a few years, and it declined, then, in 1978, and has since risen.

Do you have any explanation for these anomolies on these decline curves?

A No, sir, I would have to suppose that it stems from who was recording the figures at the time, and unfortunately there's no way of checking that now.

Q. You mean some of the recording may have been at variance with the reporting at other times, huh?

A. That is correct. I've been party to enough field operations to know just how accurate these numbers really are.

- Q. With Gulf?
- A. With any oil company.
- Q. Okay. Now, your production from the Montoya, your oil production, starts off at a level that is somewhat comparable with the original completion data as given on Exhibit Two, but the Fusselman shows from the

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beginning here only about, maybe, 15 to 20 barrels of oil per day.

A Okay. What you are looking on the Exhibit

Number Five-A is a daily average. If the Fusselman oil

dropped off rapidly over the first six months that it pro
duced, that will be shown as a daily average rather than
a daily average over six-months time.

Q These are annual averages, though, for the points on the graph, aren't they?

A Annual averages except where I had a short short year.

And although it came in with a potential of 166 barrels per day in the Fusselman, the first production figures for the average was only 15 barrels per day.

A. Yes, sir.

Q. And as far as you know, the pressures in both zones are equivalent and approximately 1000 pounds at bottom hole.

A. To my knowledge.

Now, you gave us a proposal for allocation of oil and water. What about gas?

I believe I proposed 50 percent on the gas, as well, 50 percent to each.

Q. Okay, which is the same as oil.

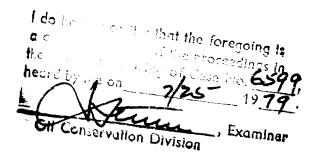

ORDER OF THE DIVISION

BY THE DIVISION:

This cause came on for aring at 9 a.m. on July 25, 1979, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner Daniel S. Nutter.

NOW, on this 16th day of August, 1979, the Division Director, having considered the testimony, the record, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

- (1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Division has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.
- (2) That the applicant, Gulf Oil Corporation, is the owner and operator of the W. A. Ramsay Well No. 4, located in Unit M of Section 36, Township 24 South, Range 37 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico.
- (3) That the applicant seeks authority to commingle Fusselman and Montoya production within the wellbore of the above-described well.
- (4) That from the Fusselman zone, the subject well is capable of low marginal production only.
- (5) That from the Montoya zone, the subject well is capable of low marginal production only.
- (6) That the proposed commingling may result in the recovery of additional hydrocarbons from each of the subject pools, thereby preventing waste, and will not violate correlative rights.

-2-Case No. 6599 Order No. R-6077

- (7) That the reservoir characteristics of each of the subject zones are such that underground waste would not be caused by the proposed commingling provided that the well is not shut-in for an extended period.
- (8) That to afford the Division the opportunity to assess the potential for waste and to expeditiously order appropriate remedial action, the operator should notify the Hobbs district office of the Division any time the subject well is shut-in for 7 consecutive days.
- (9) That in order to allocate the commingled production to each of the commingled zones in the subject well, 50 percent of the commingled oil production and 50 percent of the commingled gas production should be allocated to the Fusselman zone, and 50 percent of the commingled production to the Montoya zone.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- (1) That the applicant, Gulf Oil Corporation, is hereby authorized to commingle Fusselman and Montoya production within the wellbore of W. A. Ramsay Well No. 4, located in Unit M of Section 36, Township 24 South, Range 37 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico.
- (2) That 50 percent of the commingled oil production and 50 percent of the commingled gas production shall be allocated to the Fusselman zone and 50 percent of the commingled production shall be allocated to the Montoya zone.
- (3) That the operator of the subject well shall immediately notify the Division's Hobbs district office any time the well has been shut-in for 7 consecutive days and shall concurrently present, to the Division, a plan for remedial action.
- (4) That jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Division may deem necessary.

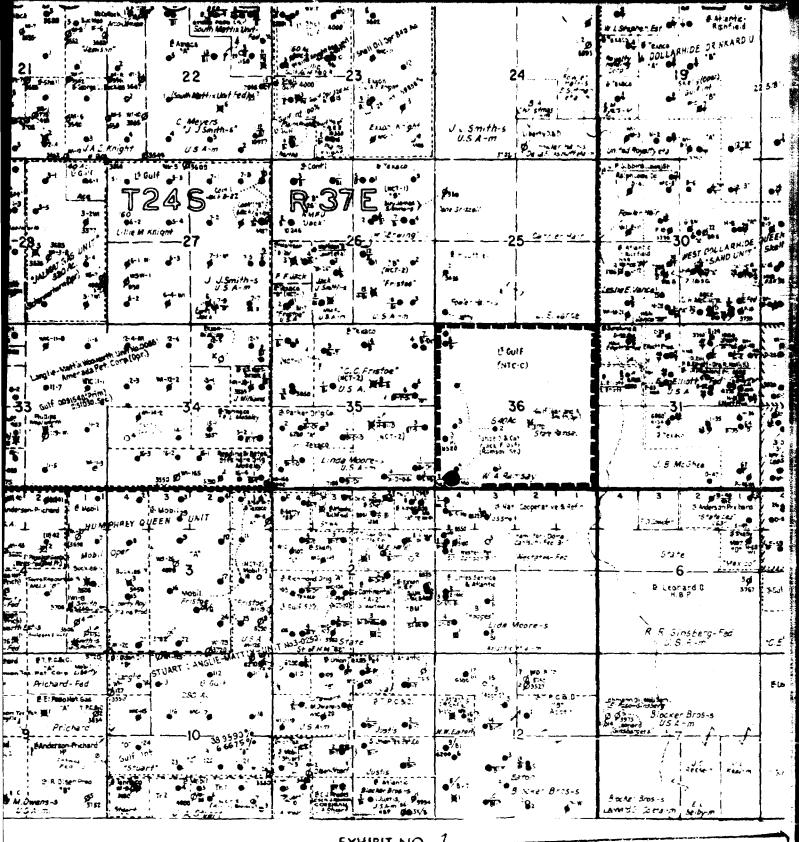


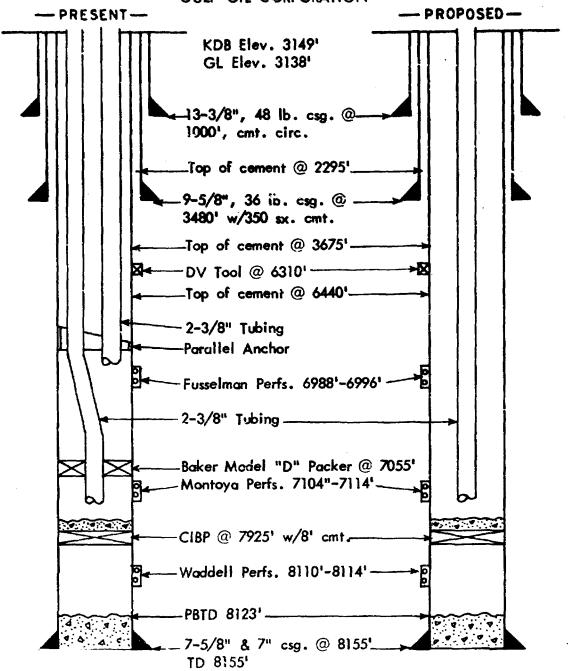

Triple completed with the North Justis Waddell (8110'-8114') under Order No. R-2430. Waddell was plugged and abandoned 11-71.

(4) Current Production: See attached C-116.

(5) Production Decline and Well History: See attached curves for decline.

Well was spudded on October 29, 1962 and drilled to a total depth of 8155'. Seven inch production casing was set at 8155'. The well was triple completed in the North Justis Fusselman, North Justis Montoya, and North Justis Waddell zones under Order No. R-2430. The Waddell was perforated in the interval 8110'-8114' and treated with 500 gallons of 15% NE acid and 2000 gallons of 15% HCL. Initially, the well flowed 198 BOPD on a 12/64" choke.

In 1963, the zone was reacidized with 1000 gallons 15% HCL and additional zones were perforated and treated with 2000 gallons Super F acid. Additional zones that were perforated and treated included 8109-8113', and 8090-8094'. The Wad ell zone was TA'd on 8-18-64 and plugged on 11-17-71.

The Montoya zone was perforated in the interval 7104-14 and treated with 500 gallons 15% NE acid. The zone was squeezed and reperforated in the interval 7110-14' and treated with 1250 gallons 15% HCL. The Montoya zone initially flowed 188 BOPD after completion. The Fusselman was perforated in the interval 6988'-6996' and treated with 1000 gallons 15% HCL. Initial production from the Fusselman zone was 166 BOPD.

- (6) Estimated Bottom Hole Pressure: The bottom hole pressure for both zones is estimated to be 1000 psi based on offset information.
- Fluid Characteristics: Production from the North Justis Fusselman and North Justis Montoya pools is being commingled in surface storage facilities under Administrative Order PC-72. No evidence of fluid incompatibility has been experienced to date and no future problems are anticipated.

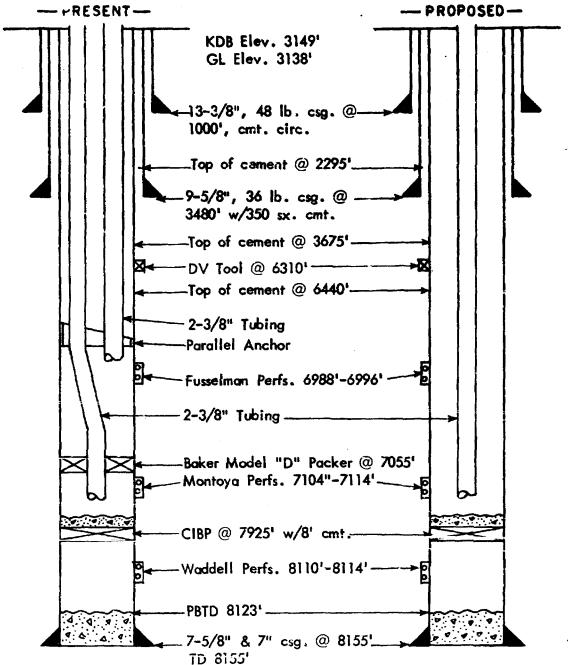

Presently, the well is dually completed in the Fusselman and Montoya pools of the North Justis field, and production from these zones is being surface commingled on the subject lease. We have not observed any evidence of fluid incompatibility at this facility and do not anticipate any reservoir damage due to the downhole commingling proposed herein. Ownership of both pools is common and no correlative rights will be violated.

The subject well is being produced by a dual pumping unit installation. If this application is approved, existing pumping equipment will be utilized to produce the fluid from the commingled zones. We plan to run tubing through the lowest perforations and keep the well pumped down to prevent crossflow between the two pools. If this application is approved, we will contact the Supervisor of the Division's Hobbs office to determine suitable allocation formula.
