





the Examiner a history of each of the wells that are reflected therein?

A. Yes, sir. For the purpose of continuity I will discuss these wells in the chronological order, that is, in the time sequence of their completions. And the first well to be drilled in this locality is that identified as the Nelson Moore Well No. 1 in Unit O of Section 33, Township 30 North, Range 29 East.

The application for the permit to drill was submitted July 18th, 1951 by the Nelson Moore Development Company. It was reported completed as a gas well on May 31st, 1952 at a depth of twenty-six hundred and eighty five feet, flowing four hundred and eighty-eight thousand cubic feet per day of carbon dioxide. On June 23rd, 1952 the operator filed a report for deepening the well to two thousand, six hundred and ninety-eight feet. On the same date he requested permission to hold the well shut in or temporarily abandoned awaiting a market outlet. On September 31st, 1954 the well was taken over by Gruemmer Industries with a proposal for plugging back to two thousand, two hundred and seventy feet and re-drilling to either twenty-four hundred or twenty-six hundred feet, according to the Form C-101 submitted. There are no additional well reports in our files, so the actual depth that it was re-drilled to or plugged back to is unknown.

The second well to be drilled in this pool is that

identified as the Russell Black Ltd. Well No. 1, located in Unit P of Section 33, Township 30 North, Range 29 East. The Form C-101, or the Notice of Intent to Drill was filed October 19th, 1953 by Gruemmer Indian Carbonic Ltd. and was reported completed on January 15th, 1954 at the total depth of two thousand four hundred and sixty-one feet. No official forms were filed at that time, however. There is a fair amount of correspondence in our file concerning casing problems, water troubles, and so on, and in these letters is mentioned that the Des Moines CO2 plant began operating in March 1954. On July 2nd, 1954 the Form C-105 was filed for this well and gave its potential as two hundred thousand cubic feet of carbon dioxide per day. There are no additional reports in the file.

that was filed gives it as being Gruenmer Industries.

Those three wells are listed on our docket as coming under Case 5552.

The fourth well drilled here is that described on our docket by Case 5553 as the Knight and Stockley Homer Schmitt Well No. 1. This is located in Unit P of Section 4, Township 29 North, Range 29 East. The Notice of Intent to Drill was filed September 22nd, 1954. The Completion Report was filed June 30th, 1955. The total depth is not given, but a progress report which was filed on June 22nd states that the well would be plugged back to two thousand, five hundred and sixty-five feet. I have no information as to what they were plugging back from, The perforations are reported to be at two thousand, five hundred and sixty-four to two thousand, five hundred and sixty-five, twenty-four hundred to twenty-four hundred and one, twenty-three hundred and ninetytwo to twenty-three hundred and ninety-three, twenty-three seventy-eight to twenty-three seventy-nine and from two thousand three hundred and forty-four feet to two thousand three hundred and forty-eight feet. The initial production is given as one million cubic feet per day. That is all of the information that is contained by our files.

Now, I did not go to the State Records Bureau to search for production data, but there is none in this office.

Mr. Ulvog, are you aware of any other communication
 relative to the status of these wells that should be called
 to the Examiner's attention?

A. Well, yes, I think perhaps there are some letters in the files that should be mentioned. They were letters exchanged between the operators and the Cil Conscrvation Commission personnel in connection with water problems, with poor cement jobs, with the failure to file reports and for errors that were later discovered in the reports that had been filed. I could refer to them if you like, otherwise they will be in the well files.

- Q Have you prepared an exhibit summarizing the status of these wells in these consolidated cases?
- A. Yes, I have. I have an exhibit which consists of a summary of the data that is present in our files, a map showing the locations of the wells and the location of the processing plant and the City of Des Moines. Also, I have photographs of the wells and of the plant site that I took on June 24th, 1975 when I made a field inspection. And also there is a discussion of the conditions as I found them, and also a summary of information which I obtained from a number of people in the Des Moines area who were familiar with the plant operations and also the land owners.
 - Q. Has that been marked?
 - A. Yes, sir.

MR. CARR: This is marked as Oil Conservation Commission Exhibit A.

Q (Mr. Carr continuing.) Mr. Ulvog, in your opinion could failure to plug these wells result in waste?

A. That is correct. Not only waste of carbon dioxide but probably what is worse, a pollution problem with respect to the ground waters because all of the wells are standing with the wellheads in place and by reports in the files, correspondence in the files, there were water problems encountered and there is the remains of what apriors to be a water-separation facility at the plant site, together with a report from one of the men who operated the plant for a period of about two years who pointed out that they did have a problem with water in the wells and if the wells were shut down for any length of time, it was necessary to bail or swab the wells dry of water before they would again flow. Therefore, the indication is that all of the wells made water and could be standing full of water at this time.

Q What type of plugging program do you recommend for these wells?

A. I would recommend that the wells be -- we would have to reenter the wells, the wellheads and so on be removed and we would have to reenter the wells to find out where the depths and perforations are, then all of the perforated intervals be cemented.

Q And this would be done at the time the wells were reentered?

- A. That is correct.
- Q In accordance with a Commission-approved program?
- A. That is right.
- Q Do you have anything further to add to your testimony?

A No, but I would like to add that all of the well sites have lumber, iron scraps, concrete and so on, on them, which would have to be cleaned up and that the location of the first well is at the plant site. Therefore, not only is the well present there and some of the debris that was probably left when the well was drilled, but also a great deal of the remnants of the plant. The plant was cannibalized and some of the machinery is still there, the foundations of the plant are there, the office building which has been badly vandalized is right there at the well site, so there is an excessive amount of debris on the location for the first well.

In the case of the fourth well, that's the Knight and Stockley well, there are two large pits that were never filled, a couple of large heaps of dirt and rock plus concrete and enough lumber and sheet metal, so it looks as if there might have been a building there that has collapsed and, in fact, that is obscuring the actual well at the moment, so I did not actually see the wellhead there because it is completely

covered up with all of this junk, but the land owner insisted that the well is still there, wellhead and all.

MR. CARR: At this time, Mr. Examiner, I would offer Oil Conservation Commission Exhibit A in Cases 5552 and 5553.

MR. NUTTER: Prior to admitting the exhibit, I would like to clarify a couple of points on the exhibit.

Mr. Carr, the first part of the exhibit consists of a report which has been signed by your witness, Mr. Ulvog. On the fourth page of that report there are some notations made there or some lines scratched out, would you clarify exactly what the status of that paragraph is?

MR. CARR: On the fourth page certain lines have been crossed out due to the fact that the typist in typing this repeated a couple of ines. It is simply to correct a typographical error.

MR. NUTTER: Would you read into the record the correct wording of the last paragraph on page four?

MR. CARR: The last paragraph should read: (Reading)

It is obvious that some action in this matter is urgently

needed. There is on file a ten thousand dollar blanket

bond in the name of Henry C. Gruemmer dba Gruemmer Industries

and another ten thousand blanket bond in the name of Russell

Stockley. Several forms in the well file were signed by

were addressed to him. Presumably additional data concerning this entire affair can be obtained from records at the Union County Courthouse and possibly from a search of the records salvaged at the site. Attached are photographs taken during the field inspection. (End of mading.)

Paragraph C on page one and it refers to the Gruemmer

Industries No. 1 R. L. Black well and it has been corrected

to read Gruemmer Industries No. 2 R. L. Black well.

MR. NUTTER: Which is the well that has been advertised?

MR. CARR: That is correct.

CROSS EXAMINATION

BY MR. NUTTER:

Q. Okay, now, the fifth page of the exhibit is the map, the sixth page is the mounting of four photographs, the seventh page is the mounting of three photographs, and the fourth page, Mr. Ulvog, appears to be a report on the plant at Des Moines, Union County, New Mexico, but everything is in the present tense and that the president is Mr. Gruemmer, the plant is managed. Is this an ancient report that has been included?

A That is. I do not know the date of the report, but it was obviously prepared after the first two wells were on

production and before the last two wells were connected to the plant, because it speaks of only two wells. Consequently it would have to be the first two wells. That report must have been prepared in about 1954 or 1955 and this was prepared by people outside of the Oil Conservation Commission.

- Q This is no present status of the situation?
- A. In no sense at all, because the plant after that time was taken over by two other parties, the Frick Company; and the Dye Chemical Company succeeded that operation.
 - Do you know when the plant ceased to operate?
- A I was unable to determine this exactly. I have made a rew estimates on it, but I don't have anything specific.

 I would say that the plant had to operate until about 1957 or 1958 under the Gruemmer management, then approximately two more years under the management of the Dye Chemical Company and then it was taken over -- a period of time elapsed between these changes in the operations -- but about 1965 it was taken over, purchased by the Dye Chemical Company which, however, did not actually operate the plant, but they did have a caretaker there and so on for a year or two, at which time they proceeded to cannibalize, ship out all of the equipment and so on, in approximately 1970 the land and facilities remaining there were sold to the City of Des Moines, and since that time the City has sold off all of the buildings, except the office building, and has

converted part of that site to a city dump, and that is the condition that it is in today.

- Q The land does belong to the City of Des Moines then?
- A. The land on which the plant and the first well was drilled does belong to the City of Des Moines, that would be a forty-acre tract which is shown on my map.
- Q Then the building which is shown in one of the photographs belongs to the City of Des Moines?
- A. That is correct and it is almost immediately adjoining the Number 1 well.
- Q. What amount of land does the City own there, do you know?
- A. Forty acres. This is the report that I got from the Mayor of Des Moines.
- Now, on your plat in the southwest quarter of the southeast quarter of Section 33, you have a letter indicated by the letter A?
- A. That is right. That is my coding system and I have discussed them on the first page.
 - Q That is the Nelson Development Company No. 1?
 - A. Which was later taken over by Gruemmer.
 - And then adjacent to that there is a little x?
 - A. That is correct.
 - Q Is that the location of the plant?
 - A. This would be the location, as I recall from that

report, the location of a facility which I have shown by a photograph, which I could not positively identify, but I assume was a water separation facility near the plant. There were some concrete pilings there, some pipe remaining, and a pipeline, incidentally, that connects the wells to the plant. It is still in place, it comes in at that point.

- Q Then the location of the plant is not specifically shown but it would be near that x, is that correct?
 - A. That is correct.

MR. NUTTER: Are there any further questions of the witness? He may be excused.

Does anyone have anything further? Do you have anything further, Mr. Carr?

MR. CARR: Nothing further.

MR. NUTTER: Does anyone have anything they wish to offer in Cases 5552 and 5553?

OCC Exhibit Number A is admitted into evidence.

If there is nothing further in these cases we will take the cases under advisement.
