ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 a.m. on January 5, 1977, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner Daniel S. Nutter.

NOW, on this 25th day of January, 1977, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the testimony, the record, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

- (1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.
- (2) That the applicant, Atlantic Richfield Company, seeks approval of an unorthodox gas well location of its Robinson Gas Com Well No. 1 to be drilled 1850 feet from the North line and 660 feet from the West line of Section 27, Township 17 South, Range 29 East, NMPM, to test the Morrow formation, Grayburg-Morrow Gas Pool, Eddy County, New Mexico.
- (3) That the N/2 of said Section 27 is to be dedicated to the well.
- (4) That a well at said unorthodox location will better enable applicant to produce the gas underlying the proration unit.
- (5) That no offset operator appeared at the hearing to oppose the proposed unorthodox location.

(6) That approval of the subject application will afford the applicant the opportunity to produce its just and equitable share of the gas in the subject pool, will prevent the economic loss caused by the drilling of unnecessary wells, avoid the augmentation of risk arising from the drilling of an excessive number of wells, and will otherwise prevent waste and protect correlative rights.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- (1) That an unorthodox gas well location for the Morrow formation is hereby approved for applicant's Robinson Gas Com Well No. 1 to be drilled 1850 feet from the North line and 660 feet from the West line of Section 27, Township 17 South, Range 29 East, NMPM, Grayburg-Morrow Gas Pool, Eddy County, New Mexico.
- (2) That the N/2 of said Section 27 shall be dedicated to the above-described well.
- (3) That jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.

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MR. NUTTER: We will call Case Number 5828.

MS. TESCHENDORF: Case 5828, application of Atlantic Richfield Company for an unorthodox gas well location, Eddy County, New Mexico.

MR. HINKLE: I would like for the record to show the same appearance in this case as in the two previous cases. We have one witness and three exhibits.

(THEREUPON, the witness was duly sworn.)

I. J. NATOUR

called as a witness, having been first duly sworn, was examined and testified as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. HINKLE:

- Q State your name, your residence and by whom you are employed?
- A. My name is I. J. Natour, I live in Midland, Texas and I'm employed by Atlantic Richfield.
 - Q. What is your position with Atlantic Richfield?
 - A. I'm an operations engineer.
- Q. Have you previously testified before the Oil Conservation Commission?
 - A. No, sir.
 - Q State briefly your educational background and

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your qualifications as a petroleum engineer?

A. I received my B.S. degree from Texas Tech University in 1973 and my Master's degree in 1974 in chemical engineering and I've been practicing petroleum engineering for the last two and a half years, two of them are in Eddy County, New Mexico.

- Q. Are you familiar with the area which is involved in this case?
 - A. Yes, sir.
- Q Have you made a study of this area and of all of the wells in the area?
 - A. Yes, sir.

MR. HINKLE: Are his qualifications sufficient?
MR. NUTTER: Yes, they are.

- Q (Mr. Hinkle continuing.) Are you familiar with the application of Atlantic Richfield in this case?
 - A. Yes, sir.
 - Q What is Atlantic Richfield seeking to accomplish?
- A. Atlantic Richfield is requesting an unorthodox location to be eighteen, fifty from the north and six, sixty from the west line of Section 27, 17 South, 29 East with the north half of the section dedicated to the well.
- Q. Have you prepared or has there been prepared under your direction exhibits for introduction in this case?
 - A. Yes.
 - Q They are the coes that have been marked One, Two and

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Three?

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A. That's true.

@ Refer to Exhibit Cne and explain what this is and what it shows?

A. Exhibit One is a part of Eddy County, New Mexico, a land map, it shows shallow and deep wells drilled on and around the would-be dedicated acreage to the unorthodox location and outlined in red it shows the dedicated acreage to the proposed well.

Q Does it show all of the wells that have been drilled in the area?

- A. Yes, sir.
- Q Including gas wells?
- A. True.
- Q Refer to Exhibit Two and explain what this is?
- A. Exhibit Two is the New Mexico Oil Conservation

 Commission C-102. It's a location and acreage dedication plat

 that shows the proposed well location and footage from each line.
 - Q And this is an unorthodox location?
 - A. Yes, sir.
 - Q Refer to Exhibit Three and explain this?
- A. Exhibit Three is a structure map contoured on a marker inside of the Morrow formation. It shows a little noseing effect to the southeast that covers part of our would-be dedicated acreage. At the same time it shows deep wells

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drilled around our proposed location with the green being the Atoka producers, the orange being the Morrow producers and the yellow being Atoka and/or Morrow dry hole.

Q. What is the potential and the production history of the wells which offset your proposed location?

A. Refer to Section 21, the well in the southeast southeast was drilled and completed in January of 1971 for a CAOF of four and a half million per day. The cumulative taken from the Commission books through October of 1976 was three and a half billion cubic feet and forty-eight point nine MBO.

MR. NUTTER: Which well was that again, please?

A. The well in Section 21, the southeast of the southeast quarter.

MR. NUTTER: You said three and a half billion?

A. Three and a half billion cumulative and forty-eight point nine MBO.

The October production of the well was seven hundred and fifty-three MCF per day and four barrels per day.

The well in the north half of Section 28 was completed in November of 1972 for a calculated potential of four point eight million cubic feet per day. The cumulative through October of 1976, taken from the New Mexico Oil Commission books was two point nine billion cubic feet and forty-four thousand barrels of oil. The production during October was one thousand and eighty MCF per day and five barrels of oil per day.

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The well in the south half of Section 28 is a dual Morrow and Atoka completion. The well was completed in August of 1973 for a calculated potential from the Morrow of four hundred and seventy-five MCF per day and three point four million cubic feet per day from the Atoka zone. The cumulatives through October of 1976 are five hundred and eighteen million cubic feet from the Morrow and two point one billion cubic feet from the Atoka, plus twenty thousand three hundred and thirty-four barrels of oil.

The October production was as follows: The Morrow, a hundred and twenty MCF per day; the Atoka eleven hundred and fifty-two MCF per day, plus three barrels of oil per day. All three wells are operated by Horizon Oil & Gas Company.

- Q. What is the footage location of the well in the south east quarter of the southeast quarter of 21?
- A. The southeast quarter of the southeast quarter of Section 21 is six sixty from each line, the south line and the east line.
- Q. And the other two wells is the north half and the south half of 28, are they regular locations?
 - A. Yes, sir, they are legal locations.
- Q What is the reason for your proposed unorthodox location in the north half of 27?
- A. The reason for this unorthodox location is going high on the structure to be able to drain our acreage more

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sufficiently and also protect our correlative rights.

Q. In the event this well is drilled and completed as a fairly good well, do you anticipate that any other wells will be drilled in 27?

- A. Yes, sir, if this well came in as a producer we will propose another well in the south half of Section 27.
- Q Does Atlantic Richfield have the leasehold interests on the entire south half of 27?
- A. No, sir. We do have the lease on all except eighty acres owned by Tenneco Oil Company.
 - Q. Which eighty acres is that?
 - A. It's the west half of the southwest quarter.
- Q In drilling this well you would contemplate working out a communitization agreement with Tenneco?
 - A. That is correct.
 - Q Does Tenneco own the offset acreage in 28, Section
- A. It seems like they own an interest in the two wells in Section 28,
 - Q What about the well in Section 21?
 - A. I really don't know.
- Q. But all three of these wells are operated by Horizon Oil Company?
 - A. Yes, sir.
 - O Do you have any further comments with respect to

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Exhibit Number Three?

- A. No, sir.
- Were all of the offset owners furnished with copies of your application in this case?
 - A. Yes, sir.
 - Q. Have you had any protests from any of them?
- A. Yes, we did. We had a protest from Tenneco Oil Corporation and from Dorchester Oil Company, Dorchester Exploration, Incorporated.
- Q. And copies of those letters have been furnished to the Commission?
 - A. Yes, sir.
 - Q Those are the only protests that you have had?
 - A. That is correct.
- Q. In your opinion, if this application is approved would it be in the interest of conservation, prevention of waste and protect correlative rights?
 - A. Yes, sir.
 - Q. We would like to offer Exhibits One, Two and Three.
- MR. NUTTER: Arco Exhibits One, Two and Three will be admitted.

(THEREUPON, Arco's Exhibits One, Two and

Three were admitted into evidence.)

MR. HINKLE: That's all we have on direct.

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CROSS EXAMINATION

BY MR. NUTTER:

- What was your name? Q.
- I. J. Natour, N-a-t-o-u-1.
- Mr. Natour, what are these contours on your Exhibit Number Three based on?
- These contours are based on a shale break within the Morrow formation and this shale break, you can carry it all over the Morrow production area where we can map on one continuous break, so to speak.
 - Now, you've identified it as Morrow Marker B?
 - Yes, sir.
- Is this fairly close to the productive interval these other wells are producing from?
- Yes, it's fairly close to the productive interval. It's actually in the middle of the Morrow formation, give or take a little bit.
- Okay. Now, are all of these wells producing from more or less the same correlative interval that you will be attempting to complete this well in?
 - As far as we can correlate it is.
- In other words so that the contours would indicate, the high would be over here to the west and the structure would slope towards the east of your proration unit here, is that correct?

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A. That is correct.

Q. Now, in your opinion would the entire proration unit be productive of gas if you got a well at your proposed location?

A. Yes, we think so.

Movever, the wells in the northwest of 23 and the well in the southeast of 22 were drilled at approximately the mid point of the contour intervals across your proration unit and they were dry in the Morrow, were they not?

A. Yes, they were. That's one particular characteristic of the Morrow formation. Actually you can drill between two dry holes as presented in Section 15 and the northwest corner of Section 23. We can see two dry holes and one Morrow completion right between them.

Q Now, there have been no Morrow wells drilled to the south of your proposed location at all, has there?

A. No, sir.

MR. NUTTER: Does anyone have any further questions of Mr. Natour? He may be excused.

(THEREUPON, the witness was excused.)

MR. NUTTER: Do you have anything further, Mr. Hinkle?

MR. HINKLE: That's all we have.

MR. NUTTER: We have the two letters of objection.

please read them for us, the first sentence anyway?

MS. TESCHENDORF: The letter from Tenneco Oil

Comes Atlantic Richfield Company, acting by and through, the undersigned attorney, and hereby makes application for approval for an unorthodox gas well location. Said location is 1,850 feet South of the North line and 660 feet East of the West line of Section 27, Township 17 South, Range 29 East, Eddy County, New Mexico, said well to be projected to approximately 11,150 feet to test the Morrow Zone of Pennsylvanian age, and the dedication to said well of the North-Half (N/2) of said Section 27. In support of this application, the Applicant respectfully shows:

- 1. Statewide Rule 104 specifies that an orthodox well location will be 1,980 feet from the nearest end boundary and 660 feet from the nearest side boundary.
- 2. Applicant believes that the proposed unorthodox location is the most strategic position to obtain production from the Morrow Zone of Pennsylvanian age.
- 3. The North-Half (N/2) of said Section 27 is covered by oil and gas leaseholds owned by the Applicant, and Continental Oil Company (who has farmed out its interest to the Applicant). The proposed well will be designated as Robinson Gas Com No. 1.






