

MR. NUTTER: The hearing will come to order, please. The Commission will take up Case 3294 which is in the matter of the hearing called by the Oil Conservation Commission on it's own motion and to permit all other parties to show cause why Bond Well Number 1 in Section 17, Township 9 North, Range 14 West should not be ordered plugged.

MR. DURRETT: If the Examiner please, Jim Durrett appearing on behalf of the Commission and it's staff. We're prepared to present a witness in this case concerning the plugging of the well, but I'm advised that Mr. Sechler may be present and would like to make a statement.

MR. NUTTER: Is there anyone present who would like to make an appearance in this case?

MR. DURRETT: We have no objection to Mr. sechler being sworn to present testimony or just to give a statement concerning this matter if he would like, Mr. Examiner.

MR. NUTTER: Would you care to make a sworn statement in this regard?

MR. SECHLER: Well--

MR. NUTTER: What is your position?

MR. SECHLER: You might say I'm the comptroller and I wish to make a statement, I wish to make a sworn statement that we intend to go ahead with this well and complete it.

MR. SECHLER: I do.

## HAROLD J. SECHLER

called as a witness herein, having been first duly sworn on oath was examined and testified as follows:

### BY MR. NUTTER:

- Q Mr. Sechler, you're Harold J. Sechler doing business as an oil producer, is that correct?
- A Yes, sir.
- Q And you or your company drilled or caused to be drilled, the Bond Well Number 1 in the Southwest Quarter, Northeast Quarter of Section 17, Township 9, 14 West?
  - A Yes, sir.
  - Q When was this well commenced?
  - A In '63.
  - Q And to what depth has the well been drilled?
- A Well, it was drilled to approximately twenty-five hundred feet.
  - Q When was active work discontinued?
- A Well, it was in October or the first part of November, it was right in there. We had a Kelly Swivel Friction Freeze on it. I have a photograph of the operation. The rig is still on

the lease, still over the well. This was a picture of the operation at that time and it stands except for the drill pipe going in the derrick, stands in the derrick.

- Q Now, this active operation was discontinued in October or November of 1963?
  - A That's right.
- Q Well, now we're in the latter part of September of 1965, which is almost two years later. What is the reason for the lag in continuing the active operation?

A Well, we had some trouble and difficulty in locating a swivel of the type that we needed for this rig and this operation to match the rig and so forth. We have procured—this swivel and I would like to proceed with the operation if the weather permits. I mean this is something—we're about six miles from, give or take a mile or two, from the highway and it poses a problem getting in and out of the lease. It's in a mountainous area.

- Q What is the nearest town to this location, Mr. Sechler?
- A Gallup, New Mexico.
- Q What direction from Gallup is this well?
- A Southeast.
- Q It's out there south of Highway 66, then?
- A Yes, sir.
- Q Well, now, Mr. Sechler, we've got winter coming up



again. If the well isn't taken care of soon, why, it's going to be a matter of being held up for another six months on account of weather, won't it be? You mentioned weather conditions.

A Yes, I understand this. We did not encounter any water zones or anything or any zone that might be contaminated or that we might contaminate in drilling this well. I don't think it's hurting anything. It has a bottom plug and it's full of bentonite to surface and there's a cover over the well.

Q What is your actual position in the case, are you requesting that the case be continued to a later date or just what--

A Well, I would like to have permission to go ahead with the well. I don't know what you're procedure is in this manner.

MR. DURRETT: Maybe I can be of assistance, Mr.

Examiner.

MR. NUTTER: Mr. Durrett, would you relate the staff's position in this matter?

MR. DURRETT: Yes, I certainly will. Mr. Sechler, I propose to present a witness here today, Mr. Kapteina, who is the District Supervisor of the District in which your well is located, who will testify that in his opinion this well should be plugged in order to prevent waste.

Now, in the past we have had similar situations of this nature where an operator did desire to go ahead and rework



the well, but I would suggest that you make a specific request to the Examiner and give him some supporting statements to show your intentions along that line.

### CROSS EXAMINATION

# BY MR. DURRETT:

- Q Let me ask you this. You do intend to go ahead with the well, you would like to do so?
  - A Definitely.
- Q How long do you think it would take you to complete it, it is not completed, is that correct?
- A That's right. Well, depending naturally upon weather conditions, this is one of the main factors. It is a long ways from town. This makes it difficult for crews getting in and out. In as much as it has been open this long I would like to have it set over until May.
  - Q Until May?
  - A Yes.

MR. NUTTER: Mr. Sechler, I might point out here we have a letter from you dated May 14, of 1965, in which you state. "It is our plan to resume operation on the well on or before June 10, 1965".

- A This is true.
- Q (By Mr. Durrett) When could you commence operations again, Mr. Sechler, barring weather? How long will it be before



you start working on the well again?

- In October.
- In October?
- Yes.
- So, we're talking about a month or so?
- That's right.
- Then you feel that due to the weather conditions and the problems encountered in drilling, that you would probably be until May before you had it completed?
- Well, no. If we get in and are able to, without any interruption as far as weather is concerned, I believe we could be out of there within forty-five days.
- But, at any rate you feel you could start work on the well again, active work on the well, within a period of thirty or forty-five days, would that be correct?
  - Yes.

MR. NUTTER: Mr. Sechler, we'll continue this Case Number 3294 to the Examiner Hearing which will be held at 9:00 o'clock a.m. at this same place on November 23rd. Now, this is going to give you sixty days in which you can resume your operations. At that hearing in November on the 23rd, if we don't have evidence that the well is again activated, I think Mr. Durrett will go ahead and present his case then, for the plugging of the well. He's going to defer his case at this time.

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### A Thank you.

MR. IRBY: Mr. Examiner, may I ask this witness a couple of questions, please?

MR. NUTTER: Yes, sir.

### CROSS-EXAMINATION

# BY MR. IRBY:

- Q I'm Frank Irby, State Engineer's Office. You said this well has a plug in it and that it's filled with bentonite?
  - A Right.
- Q This is a cement plug. Is there any casing in the hole or is it an open hole all the way?
  - A It has some casing, yes.
  - Q How much?
  - A Oh, oh, several hundred feet.
- Q What is the total depth of the well; twenty-five hundred, you said, approximately?
  - A Approximately.
- Q Well, do you have twenty-five hundred feet of casing in it?
  - A No.
- Q Well, you say several hundred, do you know how much within a hundred feet?
  - A Well, say a couple hundred feet, yes.
  - Q Is this at the surface as you say, or is it down



where the plug is?

A No, no, it's at the surface, near the surface.

MR. NUTTER: Mr. Irby, I believe that the well file reflects that one hundred feet of 8" casing was cemented. The total depth at the time was 105 feet. The casing was cemented with 25 or more sacks of cement according to the well file.

MR. IRBY: I won't offer any objection to the tentative ruling of the Examiner. I will appear at the November 23rd hearing on this matter.

MR. NUTTER: Case Number 3294 is continued to November 23rd.

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MR. NUTTER: This hearing with come to order. The first case is 3294 in the matter of the hearing called by the Commission on its own motion to permit Harold J. Sechler, dba S&S Oil Producers, and all other interested parties to show cause why the Bond Well No. 1 located in the Southwest 4, Northeast 4, of Section 17, Township 9 North, Range 14 West, Northeast 4, of Section 17, Township 9 North, Range 14 West, Valencia County, New Mexico, should not be plugged and abandoned in accordance with a Commission-approved plugging program. Are there any appearances in Case Number 3294?

appearing on behalf of the Commission and its staff. I would like to state for the record at this time to refresh the Examiner's memory concerning some of the procedural background in this case. This case was originally docketed for the August 25, 1965, hearing. At that time it was continued until September, 1965. On September 8, 1965, at the request of Mr. Sechler's attorney it was continued to the September 22nd Sechler's attorney it was continued to the September and made hearing and on September 22nd Mr. Sechler did appear and made his statement to the Examiner and the case was continued to the hearing today. I believe if the Examiner will refer to the transcript of the September 22nd hearing, he will find that Mr. sechler stated that he had had a well in production by this hearing date and that he would appear at this hearing and so advised the Examiner.



MR. NUTTER: And that was the occasion of the 60-day continuance, is that correct?

MR. DURRETT: Sir, I believe that is correct from
September 22nd to November 23rd. Since this is a show cause
hearing and since Mr. Sechler has not decided to appear and
show cause, I would propose to present a witness to the Examiner
to establish that this well should be plugged.

MR. NUTTER: Would you go ahead and proceed with your case Mr. Durrett.

MR. DURRETT: I would like to have Mr. Kapteina sworn, please.

(Witness sworn.)

JAMES E. KAPTEINA, having been first duly sworn, was examined and testified as follows:

## DIRECT EXAMINATION

### BY MR. DURRETT:

- Q Will you please state your name and position for the record?
- A James E. Kapteina, petroleum engineer for the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission.
- Q Mr. Kapteina, are you familiar with the Bond Well Number 1 which is the subject matter of this hearing?
  - A Yes, sir. I am.
  - Q Is that well located in Southwest quarter of the



northeast quarter of Township 9 north, Range 14 west, Valencia County, New Mexico?

- A It is.
- Q And is that area within your jurisdiction as a supervisor of District 4 of the Oil Conservation Commission?
  - A Yes.
- Q Do you have in your position the Commission's official well file concerning this case?
  - A I do.
- Q Will you please refer to that well file, Mr. Kapteina and state to the Examiner when this well was drilled according to your official records?
- A C-10, Notice of Intention to Drill, dated July 19, 1963, was approved by me on July 25, 1963.
  - Q Do you have a Report of Completion on this well?
- A I have a Form C-103 stating the work performed on July 19, 1963, drilled to 105 feet and set a 100 foot of eight inch casing with 25 or more sacks of cement. He was planning then to pressure test to see that he had cement to surface.
  - Q And that was in July of 1963?
  - A Yes.
  - Q What's your next report?
- A The next report is dated November 15, 1963, and approved December 26th. This was a request for temporary



abandonment because of weather conditions.

- Q Was that approved by you at that time?
- A It was approved December 26, 1963. His total at that time 2482.
  - Q Is that your last report, Mr. Kapteina?
- A That's the last report filed by Mr. Sechler and I wrote a letter to Mr. Sechler on May 10, 1965: "After two years, or almost two years, I consider the well to be abandoned and ask that it be plugged." And on May 14, 1965, a reply from Mr. H. J. Sechler: "In answer to your letter dated May 10, 1965, it is our plan to resume operations on the well on or before June 10, 1965. We have the necessary money and equipment to go ahead with the operation to a completion. Thanking you in advance for your cooperation in this matter, Yours very truly."
- Q Do you know, Mr. Kapteina, whether or not operations were resumed in June of 1965?
- A I believe Mr. Sechler testified when he appeared here at the hearing that he had -- no operations has been started at that time.
  - Q And you have had no subsequent reports?
  - A No reports.
- Q Is it Mr. Kapteina, is it your opinion that this well had been abandoned and it should be plugged in order to prevent



### waste?

- A Well, since we haven't had subsequent reports, it appears that Mr. Sechler doesn't intend to do anything further with this well.
- Q Now, you have no knowledge as far as your official well file goes, Mr. Kapteina, to whether or not this well actually had ever been completed, is that correct? In other words, is it a producer or is it not?
  - A No, it's no producer.
- Q So, there would have been no production report of any type?
  - A No
- Q Do you feel, Mr. Kapteina, that this well should be plugged in order to confine oil, gas and other hydrocarbons in the strata in which they were originally contained?
- A Well, since he has no reports, I feel that no report of any oil or gas it should be plugged in order to protect any water that may be in the area.
- Q And what about any hydrocarbons that he may have passed through that he didn't report, Mr. Kapteina, if that was the case?
- A Well, in that case they should be confined to the strata in which they presently are located.
  - Q Do you have a plugging program at this time to

### recommend to the Examiner?

A We have no C-105 which would report any formations that were carrying any hydrocarbons or any water, why I would recommend that the -- he reported that he had placed a plug at the total depth and one at the surface. If that interval is filled with heavy mud that surface plug should be drilled out and replaced and a marker, regulation marker be placed in the well.

Q Mr. Kapteina, for the purpose of the record, will you please state what the C-105 is. Is that the well log?

A C-105 is a well log showing tops of formations passed through.

Q So, this had not been filed with you and we, from the Commission's standpoint, would have no way of knowing what formations were drilled through?

- A That's correct.
- Q Is that correct?
- A That's right.

Q So, you have no way of knowing whether or not there were oil or gas bearing formations or water bearing formations within the well, is that correct?

- A That's correct.
- Q So, you feel that the plugging program which you have outlined would confine oil, gas, water and any other hydrocarbons

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within the strata in which they were originally contained, is that correct?

- I believe so.
- Now, you are recommending that the surface plug be drilled out, the hole be filled with heavy mud to the surface and a surface plug be reinstalled --
  - With a permanent marker.
  - -- with a permanent marker?
  - A 35 foot cement plug.
  - A 35 foot cement plug at the surface?
  - That's right.

MR. DURRETT: If the Examiner please, I will move that the Commission take an official administrative notice of its official well file in this case and that will conclude my direct examination of Mr. Kapteina.

MP NUTTER: We will take notice of the file pertaining to this well on the case. Are there any questions of Mr. Kapteina? Mr. Kapteina, this program that you are recommending here today is being recommended only in the absence of further knowledge that work was done on the well, is that correct?

MR. KAPTEINA: Correct.

MR. NUTTER: In the event that we can determine that other conditions are such that would require another plugging



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program, you wouldn't want us to be bound by filling the hole with heavy mud?

MR. KAPTEINA: No.

MR. NUTTER: And putting a 35 foot --

MR. KAPTEINA: In case any other cement plugs are necessary for any pore or permeable formations, I believe they should be added.

MR. NUTTER: I see.

MR. PORTER: I have one question. Mr. Kapteina, have you made a trip to this location?

MR. KAPTEINA: I made a trip to this location just prior to its temporary abandonment.

MR. PORTER: And when was that, sir?

MR. KAPTEINA: That was in December of 1963.

MR. PORTER: Which is almost two years ago?

MR. KAPTEINA: Yes, sir.

MR. PORTER: You have had no subsequent forms filed on that well?

MR. KAPTEINA: No.

MR. PORTER: What does our rule provide as far as temporary abandonment is concerned? Does it require subsequent forms to be filed after the first form is filed showing that the well is temporarily abandoned or periodic forms that should be filed after that time?

# BY THE COMMUSSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 o'clock a.m. on Movember 23, 1965, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner Daniel S. Nutter.

guorum being present, having considered the testimony, the record, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised in the premises,

# FINDS:

- (1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.
- (2) That Harold J. Sechler, dba S. & S. Oil Producers, is the owner and operator of the Bond Well Ho. 1 located in the SW/4 ME/4 of Section 17, Township 9 North, Range 14 West, MMPM, Valencia County, New Mexico.
- (3) That the subject well is dry and abandoned and should be plugged in order to confine any crude petroleum oil, natural gas, and water in the strata originally containing them, and to otherwise prevent waste and protect correlative rights.

# IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

On May 25, 1966, a field inspection was made of S & S Oil Producers' Bond No. 1 located in the SW/4 NE/4 of Section 17, Township 9 North, Range 14 West, NMPM, Valencia County, to determine whether or not the subject well had been properly plugged as reported by Harold Sechler. A rotary rig is in position over the hole, a steel frum has been placed over the noise and a stand of drill pipe run through the rig floor to rest on the drum to prevent its removal. It is estimated that approximately 2500 feet of drill pipe is standing in the derrick.

An interview with a Park Service Employee at the El Morrow National Monument shed some light on Mr. Sechler's activities. The drilling sight is about four miles from the Monument and with water being scarce in the area; while he was engaged in his drilling activities, Mr. Sechler made it a habit to procure about ten gallons, or so, of water per day from the Park Ranger to be used as drinking water at the well site. The Ranger advised the last occasion of such procurement of water occurred about 1½ years ago or about November, 1964. He had not seen Sechler since that date, nor had he heard of any operations being carried out at the well during that period. It is worth noting that the drilling of


SUBJECT: S & S Producers' Bond No. 1

On May 25, 1966, a field inspection was made of S & S Oil Producers' Bond No. 1 located in the SW/4 NE/4 of Section 17, Township 9 North, Range 14 West, NMPM, Valencia County, to determine whether or not the subject well had been properly plugged as reported by Harold Sechler. A rotary rig is in position over the hole, a steel drum has been placed over the hole and a stand of drill pipe run through the rig floor to rest on the drum to prevent its removal. It is estimated that approximately 2500 feet of drill pipe is standing in the derrick.

An interview with a Park Service employee at the El Morrow National Monument shed some light on Mr. Sechler's activities. The drilling sight is about four miles from the Monument and with water being scarce in the area; while he was engaged in his drilling activities, Mr. Sechler made it a habit to procure about ten gallons, or so, of water per day from the Park Ranger to be used as drinking water at the well site. The Ranger advised the last occasion of such procurement of water occurred about 1½ years ago or about November, 1964. He had not seen Sechler since that date, nor had he heard of any operations being carried out at the well during that period. It is worth noting that the drilling of

the well created much interest among the inhabitants of the area and it is felt that any activity, whether dril-ling or plugging operation, would have become known.
