MR. UTZ: Case 3588.

MR. HATCH: Case 3588, Application of Pan American Petroleum Corporation for an unorthodox gas well location, Eddy County, New Mexico.

MR. BUELL: For Pan American Petroleum Corporation, Guy Buell. We have one witness, Mr. Ford.

(Witness sworn.)

MR. BUELL: I have one thing I might point out to both the Examiner and the Commission's General Counsel at the outset. The well that is the subject matter of this Rearing was advertised as Well Number 26. The truth, in fact, is that it is actually Well Number 36. However, the advertisement very correctly and previsely locates it. The only offset operator that knows of this well has furnished waivers. It would certainly be my recommendation to the Commission that, in my opinion, this is a completely harmless era and I would not recommend that they go to the expense and bother to readvertise the case.

#### GEORGE H. FORD

called as a witness on behalf of the applicant, first having been duly sworn, was examined and testified as follows:

### DIRECT EXAMINATION

#### BY MR. BUELL:

Mr. Ford, would you state your complete name, by

Α George H. Ford, staff engineer for Pan American Petroleum Corporation, Fort Worth, Texas.

Q Mr. Ford, have you testified at previous Commission Hearings and are your qualifications as a petroleum engineer a matter of public record?

(By Mr. Buell) Now, in connection with your testimony here today, Mr. Ford, would you look first at what has been identified as Pan American's Exhibit Number 1? What is that exhibit?

Exhibit 1 is a map of the Pan American Poker Lake unit area. I have shown on this exhibit Pan American's Poker Lake Number 36 as a drilling well incomplete at the present time. It is in the central portion of Exhibit 1. It is included in an area outlined by a wavy line.

What is the significance of that wavy line around the well, Mr. Ford?

- What happens when the well is paid out?
- Pan American's interest drops to four-ninths.
- All right, sir, is there any other data that would be a matter of interest to the Commission in this case shown on Exhibit 1?

Yes, sir. I have shown the Texaco's Cotton Draw Unit to the east and south of the Pan American Poker Lake Unit. There are some deep wells drilling there that might be of interest to the Commission.

- Why don't you briefly mention the deep wells in the Cotton Draw Unit that you think would be of benefit to this record?
- All right, sir. The Texaco Cotton Draw Unit Number 66 in Section 10, Township 25 South, Range 32 East, just above the title block, is drilling at below 14,000 feet. Then, going over to the west in Section 18, same township and range, is Texaco's Cotton Draw Unit Number 64. Now, this well was completed as an excellent Devonian Well. I understand now, though, that the well is falling off and has started making salt

Q All right, sir, let's go back to our Well Number 36, the subject well of this Hearing. It might be well for the Examiner and the record if you would give a brief history of this well.

was projected as a Mississipian oil wildcat test down to, I believe, 16,200 feet. Its location, 660 feet from two section lines, is regular for an oil well, but we found when we drilled the well that the Mississipian was unproductive. The Devonian information we had indicated that we had possibilities there so it was deepened to the Devonian to a total depth of 16,660 feet. The Devonian was tested and we actually made a completion and had a potential test in the Devonian.

Q What happened shortly after the well was completed in the Devonian?

A Well, first, it looked like a good Devonian well, like the Texaco's Cotton Draw Unit Number 64, but it fell off very

At any time did Pan American give any consideration to taking Well 36 on down to the Ellenburger?

Yes, sir, we did. The Texaco's Cotton Draw Unit Number 65 was very critical in this consideration. Of course, we have abandoned the idea of taking it to the Ellenburger since completion attempt in Texaco's Cotton Draw Unit Number 65 failed.

Q What are the present plans with regard to Well Number 36?

Well, we actually have a service unit on the well now, or coming back up the hole, and plan to make a completion attempt in the morrow at somewhere around 15,000 feet.

And, of course, this location, 660 from the south and east lines of the section would be irregular as a morrow gas Well?

A Yes, sir, it would.

All right, sir. Look now at what has been identified as our Exhibit Number 2. What is that exhibit?

Exhibit 2 is a gamma ray sonic log on Pan American's Poker Lake Unit Number 36 from very close to the
