ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 a.m. on June 6, 1967,
at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner Daniel S. Mutter.

NOW, on this 8th day of June, 1967, the Commission, a
quorum being present, having considered the testimony, the record,
and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised
in the premises,

FINDS:

- (1) That due public notice having been given as required by
law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject
matter thereof.
- (2) That the applicant, Tenneco Oil Company, seeks approval
of an unorthodox gas well location in the Blanco-Mesaverde Gas Pool
for its Jicarilla "B" Well No. 8 at a point 790 feet from the North
line and 2510 feet from the East line of Section 15, Township 26
North, Range 5 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico.
- (3) That the subject well was originally projected to the
Dakota formation and was drilled at a standard location for the
Basin-Dakota Gas Pool.
- (4) That a standard gas well location for the Blanco-Mesaverde
Gas Pool is not feasible due to the extremely rough terrain at said
standard location.

(5) That approval of the subject application should result in the recovery of otherwise unrecoverable gas as the applicant proposes to dually complete the subject well in the Basin-Dakota Gas Pool and the Blanco-Mesaverde Gas Pool.

(6) That approval of the subject application will afford the applicant the opportunity to produce its just and equitable share of the gas in the Blanco-Mesaverde Gas Pool, will prevent the economic loss caused by the drilling of unnecessary wells, avoid the augmentation of risk arising from the drilling of an excessive number of wells and otherwise prevent waste and protect correlative rights.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(1) That an unorthodox location is hereby approved for the Tenneco Oil Company Jicarilla "B" Well No. 8 in the Blanco-Mesaverde Gas Pool at a point 790 feet from the North line and 2510 feet from the East line of Section 15, Township 25 North, Range 5 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico.

(2) That jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.

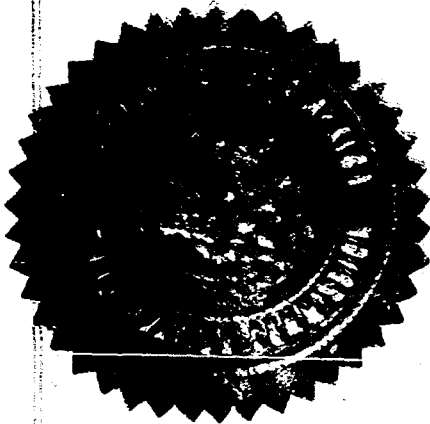

A 160-acre non-standard gas proration unit comprising the N/2 NE/4 Section 8, and the W/2 NW/4 Section 9, to be dedicated to the State "A" A/c-2 Well No. 29, located in Unit D of said Section 9.

Application of Texas Pacific Oil Company for three dual completions, Lea County, New Mexico. Applicant, in the above-styled cause, seeks authority to dually complete its State "A" A/c-2 Wells Nos. 28, 54, and 29, located in Unit I of Section 5, Unit O of Section 8, and Unit D of Section 9, respectively, Township 22 South, Range 36 East, Lea County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Jalmat Gas Pool and oil from the South Eunice Oil Pool.

Applicant, in the above-styled cause, seeks authority to commingle production from the Monument Paddock and Monument Blinbry Oil Pools in the wellbore of its L. M. Lambert Well No. 8 located in Unit G of Section 6, Township 20 South, Range 37 East, Lea County, New Mexico, with the assignment of a single allowable to said commingled production.

CASE 3594: Application of Amerada Petroleum Corporation for an Ogallala oil proration unit, special rules for said unit and authority for fresh water disposal, Lea County, New Mexico. Applicant, in the above-styled cause, seeks the establishment of the SE/4 NW/4 of Section 30, Township 18 South, Range 38 East, Lea County, New Mexico, as a 40-acre proration unit for production of oil from the Ogallala formation. Applicant also seeks the establishment of special rules governing said 40-acre tract including a maximum density of one well per 0.625-acre with a provision that wells should be drilled no nearer than 82.5 to the outer boundary of the unit and no nearer than 165 feet to another well producing from the same formation, provided that an exception should be made for existing wells on said 40-acre tract which are not located in conformance with said spacing rules. Applicant also seeks a temporary exception to Rule 307 for each well to permit utilization of a vacuum-type drilling unit during the drilling and completion operations. Applicant also seeks authority to produce the wells at capacity even though the aggregate production from said wells exceeds the 40-acre normal unit allowable. Applicant further seeks authority to dispose of fresh water produced with the oil back into the Ogallala formation through an injection well or wells located no nearer than 330 feet to the outer boundaries of the 40-acre tract.

CASE 3595: Application of Ernest A. Hanson for acreage rededication, Lea County, New Mexico. Applicant, in the above-styled cause, seeks the rededication of the SE/4 NW/4 of Section 19, Township 22 South, Range 38 East for the production of oil from the Blinebry Oil Pool, said 40-acre unit to be dedicated to applicant's Gutman Well No. 4, formerly the Gulf Oil Corporation's Max Gutman Well No. 3. Gentlemen:

Tenneco Oil Company requests Administrative Approval for exceptions to state-wide Rule 104. This request is due to topographic conditions for the above referenced well with regard to the Blanco Mesaverde Pool. The well was originally projected and completed in the Dakota Formation which is standard in regard to spacing. This well will be dually completed in the Blanco Mesaverde and Basin Dakota pools should our request be granted.

Drilling this well in an orthodox Mesaverde location would have resulted in locating the well on top of Honolulu Mesa. Thus increasing the drilling costs as well as transportation costs of products.

We have attached a plat which points out the existing topographic conditions surrounding this well. We have requested a waiver from off-set operator, Pan American Petroleum Corporation, with a request that they forward their approval or objection to your office.

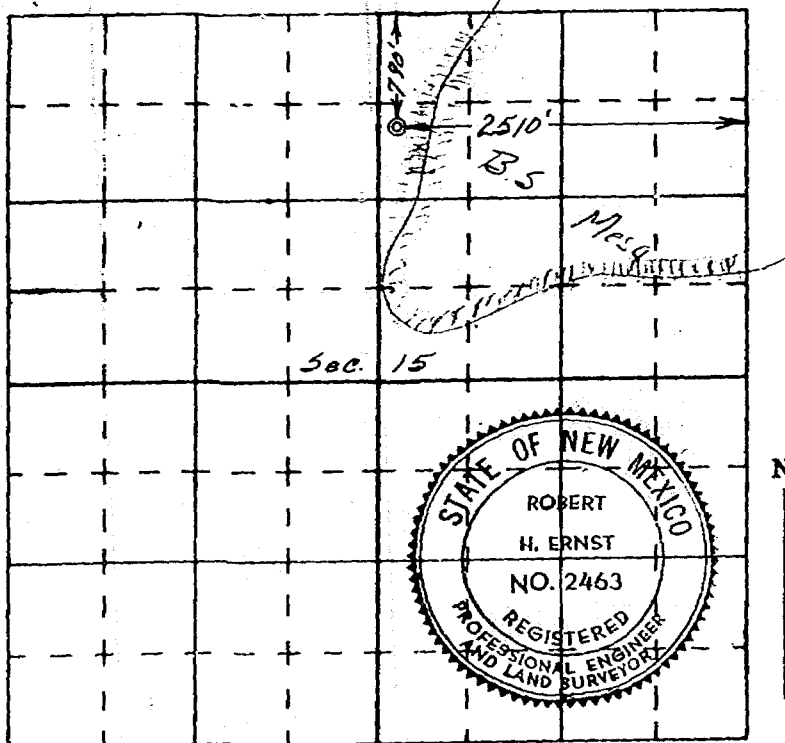

MR. NUTTER: Case 3596.

MR. HATCH: Case 3596, application of Tenneco Oil Company for an unorthodox location, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico.

MR. WHITE: If the Examiner please, Charles White of White, Kolbert, Koch and Kelly, appearing on behalf of the Applicant. We have one witness to be sworn at this time.

(Witness sworn.)

LESLIE B. PLUMB, called as a witness on behalf of the Applicant, having first been duly sworn, was examined and testified as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. WHITE:

Q Would you state your full name for the record, please?

A Leslie B. Plumb, employed as a Petroleum Engineer for Tenneco Oil Company in Durango, Colorado.

Q Have you previously testified before the Commission as a Petroleum Engineer and have your qualifications been accepted?

A Yes.

Q Will you briefly state what the petitioner seeks by the application?

A Tenneco Oil Company, requests the approval of the

location of its Jicarilla 'B' Number 8 as an unorthodox location in the Blanco-Mesa Verde Pool. This well is located seven ninety feet from the north line, twenty-five ten feet from the east line, Section 1426 North, 5 West, Rio Arriba County.

Q In what respect is this well in an orthodox location?

A The well is located in the correct quarter section. However, being twenty-five ten feet from the east line, it is beyond the tolerant boundaries normally allowed for locations for the Blanco-Mesa Verde Pool.

MR. NUTTER: Mr. Plumb, you said Section 14. All the records here indicate Section 15.

THE WITNESS: Section 15, you are correct, sir.

MR. NUTTER: Thank you.

Q (By Mr. White) Is it the correct location for the Dakota?

A Yes, the location is standard for the basin Dakota.

Q Is the well dualled?

A The well was drilled primarily as Dakota producer in the basin Dakota Pool and is now dually completed as a producer in both zones.

Q And, 660 feet is too far west for the Mesa Verde, is that correct?

A Yes, sir.

Q Is it in the correct location, so far as the north line is concerned?

A Yes, sir, at 790 feet from the north line, we are within the correct limits for a Blanco-Mesa Verde producer.

MR. WHITE: Will you mark this as Exhibit Number 1, please?

(Whereupon, Applicant's Exhibit Number 1 was marked for identification.)

MR. WHITE: Would you mark this, please?

(Whereupon, Applicant's Exhibit Number 2 was marked for identification.)

Q (By Mr. White) Will you explain your topo map marked Exhibit 1, please?

A Exhibit 1 is a topographic map prepared by the United States Department of Interior, U.S.G.S., showing the topography of the general area and specifically of Section 15, wherein lies the subject location.

Q And, the well is shown --

A The well is shown, marked B-8 in the northeast quarter of Section 15.

Q Now, will you explain why the well was drilled as an unorthodox well?

A Note that this location lies right at the foot of

area known as BS Mesa, that, this well was drilled here because it was orthodox for Basin Dakota and was a much easier location to prepare. In order to get the well into orthodox position for the Blanco-Mesa Verde, it would require about twenty-five miles additional travel to get to the location, the added cost for road and location and added drilling, tubular goods, etc., would result in an estimated additional cost for the well of approximately \$10,000.00.

Q Did the location of the well have anything to do with the structure?

A No, there is no gain for structural position for this location over the orthodox location.

Q It was strictly an economic waste?

A It was strictly economics involved in saving and the cost of drilling the well.

Q Are there any correlative rights involved in this location?

A There are no correlative rights involved. The Section 10 immediately north of Section 15 is produced by Pan-American Petroleum Corporation. They have no wells in the south half of this section, so there is no question of correlative rights.

Q How about the ownership, as to the east, west and south?

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A The ownership on the east, west and south is operated by Tenneco Oil Company and we are our own offset operator.

Q Now, refer to Exhibit 2 and explain that, please?

A Exhibit 2 is a certified plat by the land surveyor showing that the location is as stated.

MR. WHITE: At this time, we offer Exhibits 1 and 2 in evidence and that concludes our testimony on direct.

MR. NUTTER: Tenneco's Exhibits 1 and 2 will be admitted in evidence.

(Whereupon, Tenneco's Exhibits 1 and 2 were admitted in evidence.)

CROSS EXAMINATION

BY MR. NUTTER:

Q Mr. Plumb, apparently up here on the west side of this BS Mesa there is a rather sharp embankment coming down from the Mesa into the valley, there.

A Yes, there is a double plateau arrangement there.

Q And, you located the well as close as you could to an orthodox location right at the base of the cliff?

A Yes, as close as we possibly could.

MR. NUTTER: Are there any further questions of the witness. He may be excused.

(Witness excused.)


