MR. STAMETS: Call for appearances in this case. MR. COLE: Mr. Examiner, my name is Jack Cole. I'm not exactly sure of the procedure of this, but in --

MR. STAMETS: Perhaps we should have Mr. Cole sworn before he goes on. Would you like to stand, sir, and be sworn?

MR. STAMETS: You may proceed, Mr. Cole. MR. COLE: All right. In October of 1976 I staked a location, which is known as my Apache Flats No. 11, 1450 from the south and 1450 from the east of Section 28, Township 23 North, Range 4 West, Sandoval County, New Mexico.

I subsequently drilled a well and it has been connected into El Paso's pipeline for approximately eighteen or nineteen months at this point.

The Jicarilla Apache Tribe brought it to my attention that the -- they did not think the well was

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located 1450 and 1450 out of the south and east. Also, the USGS brought that to my attention and I agreed that possibly the best way out of this was to go to re-survey it, which I did.

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And we found the location to be 1712 from the south and 1223 from the east, which threw it into another quarter quarter.

How this happened I have no idea. The only thing we can think of in going back through everything with all the dirt contractors and everybody else involved, was that the -- there were a lot of cattle in that area and perhaps one of them picked up a stake and when the dirt contractor went down there he built it wherever the stake was sitting, and other than that, I have to --- as I understand it, I have to seek approval now from the Commission for a nonstandard location, and that's what I'm doing.

MR. STAMETS: Mr. Cole, do you suppose it would be better to say due to some sort of error, indeterminate error, than a cow moved the stake?

MR. COLE: Yes, sir, we can say anything you'd like.

MR. STAMETS: But obviously it was your intention to drill a well at a standard location and ---

MR. COLE: Yes, sir.

MR. STAMETS: --- just simply some sort of an error
