1. Applicant has the right to drill and develop the SW/4 NE/4 and the SE/4 NW/4 of Section 36, Township 24 South, Range 36 East, Lea County, New Mexico.
2. Applicant seeks an exception to the well location requirements of Oil Conservation Division Rule 104 C, II, (a) to permit the drilling of a well on the above mentioned acreage at an unorthodox location 2,310 feet from the North line and 1,650 feet from the East line of said Section 36 to test the Jalmat Gas Pool.
3. That a non-standard 80 acre gas proration unit comprising the SW/4 NE/4 and the SE/4 NW/4 of said Section 36 should be dedicated to the proposed well.
4. Approval of this application will afford applicant the opportunity to produce his just and equitable share of gas from the Jalmat Gas Pool, will prevent waste and will protect correlative rights.

WHEREFORE, applicant prays that this application be set for hearing before the Commission's duly appointed examiner and that, after notice and hearing as provided by law, the Division enter its order granting this application and such other relief as may be just and proper in premises.
