ASHTON B. GEREN

being called as a witness and having been duly sworn upon his oath, testified as follows, to-wit:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. WEEMS:

Q Would you please state your name, address, and by whom you're employed?

A Ashton B. Geren, Junior. I'm a consultant for Robert C. Anderson.

MR. NUTTER: How do you spell your last name, please?

A G-E-R-E-N.

Q Would you state when, where, and in what

1 discipline you received your professional degree?

2 A. I graduated in geology, Bachelor of Science,
3 Texas A & M, in 1949.

4 Q. Since graduation from Texas A & M in
5 geology, have you practiced as a geologist?

6 A. Continuously till the present date.

7 Q. How long have you been familiar with the
8 San Juan Basin area of northwestern New Mexico?

9 A. I've worked in the San Juan Basin for
10 about, approximately, sixteen years.

11 Q. Are you familiar with the facts surrounding
12 these applications for unorthodox well locations?

13 A. Right.

14 MR. WEEMS: We tender MR. Geren as an
15 expert.

16 MR. NUTTER: Mr. Geren is qualified.

17 Q. (Mr. Weems continuing.) In the case of
18 the Robert C. Anderson Ute Mountain Ute No. 1, did you file
19 the forms with the State of New Mexico to drill that well?

20 A. Yes, I did.

21 Q. And at the time that you filed those forms
22 what type of well were you going to be drilling?

23 A. This was filed as a wildcat oil well.

24 Q. And in the drilling of that particular
25 well did you encounter gas in producing quantities?

1 A Yes, we did.

2 Q Did you encounter oil?

3 A Encountered no oil.

4 Q In the case of the Robert C. Anderson Ute
5 Mountain Ute No. 3, did you file the appropriate forms with
6 the State of New Mexico for the drilling of that well?

7 A Let's see, the No. 3, well, we drilled the
8 No. 2 as a gas well up in the northwest quarter, northwest
9 northwest of this particular quarter section, and got a dry
10 hole. So then from my geology I thought we would be down
11 dip and probably in the oil range, so I filed this as an oil
12 location.

13 Q Was this filed as a wildcat oil location?

14 A Yes.

15 Q In the drilling of this well did you en-
16 counter gas in producing quantities?

17 A Yes, we did encounter gas.

18 Q And did you encounter any oil?

19 A No oil.

20 Q In your opinion would the granting of
21 these applications be in the interest of conservation, the
22 prevention of waste, and the protection of correlative rights?

23 A I do.

24 MR. WEEMS: I have no further questions.

CROSS EXAMINATION

BY MR. WEEMS:

Q Mr. Geren, when the Well No. 1 was drilled was there any oil production in that vicinity?

A Not in this particular zone. This -- this is a Dakota well, and I did the geology on the prospect and it was a very small, little structure, probably a bar, and there was no Dakota gas or oil in the immediate vicinity, and we assumed and hoped it would be an oil well because of the lack of market. We are presently building a pipeline, which is about five miles away, and so --

Q But you were expecting that the well, if productive, would be productive of oil and located it as an oil well.

A Yes, sir.

Q That was the No. 1. And then the No. 2 was drilled to the north as a gas well?

A As a gas location, after we received gas in this well, and you know, this was in the -- oh, 790 out of the north and the west corner, and this was a dry hole and low. So following my geology, I figured to get in the oil ring, and we moved over to this, I believe it's 2310 from the north and west as an oil location. And it was a gas well and structurally similar to the No. 1.

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1 Q So you drilled three wells; one was a dry
2 hole --

3 A Right.

4 Q And two staked as oil well locations but
5 were gas productive.

6 What do you have in the line of acreage
7 dedication, then, for these wells?

8 A These would be 160 for each well.

9 Q And have you obtained non-standard pro-
10 ration units for those?

11 A I don't understand what you mean on that.

12 Q Well, if they're gas wells in the Dakota
13 formation --

14 A Oh, yes, sir.

15 Q -- and so the standard dedication --

16 A Right.

17 Q -- requirement would be 320 acres.

18 A This is out of the Basin Dakota area.

19 Q Well, it's in San Juan County, New Mexico,
20 and the rule says that the Dakota producing interval in Rio
21 Arriba and San Juan Counties is the Basin Dakota Gas Pool.

22 A Yes, sir, I checked with Mr. Kendrick at
23 the time I made these gas locations and this was not con-
24 sidered. It was an exception and a new field.

25 Q But it's as -- as an oil field?

1 A. Well, no, as a gas field, based on 160's
2 and that was, you know, that was approved as that.

3 Q. I think we may have to have some unortho-
4 dex -- non-standard 160-acre proration units for this.
5 And you are building a pipeline to these wells?

6 A. We are fighting a lease expiration within
7 a short fuse, and we have three gas wells in this field,
8 and the third one is down in the southeast quarter on stand-
9 ard spacing, and --

10 Q. Of the same section?

11 A. Right, and we thought we might have some-
12 one come to us, but the field is defined; that's it, and so
13 we're building presently and should connect this pipeline
14 within, oh, four or five days about four or five miles
15 south of us.

16 Q. Now what is the location of the No. 2 Well?

17 A. The No. 2 is 790 out of the north and
18 west corner of Section 14.

19 Q. So you will have two wells in the northwest
20 quarter.

21 A. No, it's a dry hole.

22 Q. But I mean you have two wells there and
23 one's dry and you have the No. 3.

24 A. As a gas well, and then we've got a water
25 well --

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Q And then you've got the No. 1 in the southwest quarter and then you've got another gas well over in the southeast quarter?

A Yes, sir.

Q And what's the location of that?

A It's 1850 from the south and east.

Q That's right there. What do you call it?

A It's the No. 4 Ute Mountain Ute.

We did drill two other wells in the northeast quarter that were both dry and low in the Dakota.

Q In the northeast quarter.

A Right.

MR. NUTTER: Are there any further questions of Mr. Geren? He may be excused.

Do you have anything further, Mr. Weems?

MR. WEEMS: No, sir.

MR. NUTTER: Does anyone have anything they wish to offer in Case Number 6699?

We'll take the case under advisement.





ORDER OF THE DIVISION

BY THE DIVISION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 a.m. on October 17, 1979, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner Daniel S. Nutter.

NOW, on this 2nd day of November, 1979, the Division Director, having considered the testimony, the record, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

(1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Division has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.

(2) That the applicant, Robert C. Anderson, seeks approval of two unorthodox gas well locations, the first being 1980 feet from the South line and 660 feet from the West line of Section 14 for his Ute Mountain Ute Well No. 1, and the second being 2310 feet from the North line and 2310 feet from the West line of Section 14 for his Ute Mountain Ute Well No. 3, both in Township 31 North, Range 16 West, NMPM, Dakota formation, San Juan County, New Mexico.

(3) That said wells were projected as oil wells in the Dakota formation and their locations staked accordingly, but were productive of gas instead.

(4) That the Dakota reservoir from which the subject wells are productive is a separate and distinct reservoir from the Basin-Dakota Pool in Rio Arriba and San Juan Counties, New Mexico, lying west of the Hogback, and a new pool should be created for said wells by the Division and placed on 160-acre spacing, at least for the present.

(5) That the SW/4 of said Section 14 should be dedicated to the aforesaid Well No. 1 and the NW/4 of said Section 14 should be dedicated to the aforesaid Well No. 3.

(6) That approval of the subject application will afford the applicant the opportunity to produce its just and equitable share of the gas in the subject pool, will prevent the economic loss caused by the drilling of unnecessary wells, avoid the augmentation of risk arising from the drilling of an excessive number of wells, and will otherwise prevent waste and protect correlative rights.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(1) That an unorthodox gas well location for the Dakota formation is hereby approved for the Robert C. Anderson Ute Mountain Ute Well No. 1, located 1980 feet from the South line and 660 feet from the West line of Section 14, and the Ute Mountain Ute Well No. 3, located 2310 feet from the North line and 2310 feet from the West line of Section 14, both in Township 31 North, Range 16 West, NMPM, undesignated Dakota gas pool, San Juan County, New Mexico.


(2) That the SW/4 of said Section 14 shall be dedicated to the above-described Well No. 1 and the NW/4 of said Section 14 shall be dedicated to the above-described Well No. 3.

(3) That jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Division may deem necessary.
