SUPPLEMENTAL GAS PRORATION ORDER FOR THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY, 1977

This cause came on for public hearing by the Commission's Examiner, Richard L. Stamets, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, on January 19, 1977, at 9 a.m., pursuant to legal notice for the purpose of setting the allowable production of gas from the following seventeen gas pools in Lea, Eddy, Chaves, and Roosevelt Counties, New Mexico, for the month of February, 1977.

Atoka-Pennsylvanian, Blinebry, Bluitt-San Andres, Buffalo Valley-Pennsylvanian, Burton Flats-Morrow, Burton Flats-Strawn, Carlsbad-Morrow, South, Catclaw Draw-Morrow, Crosby-Devonian, Eumont, Indian Basin-Morrow, Indian Basin-Upper Pennsylvanian, Jalmat, Justis, Monument McKee-Ellenburger, Todd-Lower San Andres, and Tubb.

NOW, on this <u>25th</u> day of January, 1977, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the supplemental nominations of purchasers, the capacity of producing wells, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being otherwise fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

(1) That the total nomination of purchasers of gas produced from the above-listed seventeen gas pools for the month of February, 1977, is 26,621,599 Mcf. The individual pool nomina-tions are as follows:

(2) That the potential producing capacity of all gas wells in the seventeen gas pools listed above is in excess of the

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nominations of purchasers of gas, and in order to prevent waste and protect correlative rights, the production of gas from the listed seventeen gas pools should be limited, allocated, and distributed during the month of February, 1977.

(3) That all the producing gas wells, together with the expected completed or recompleted wells in the seventeen gas pools listed above, can produce a total of 26,621,599 Mcf without causing waste during the month of February, 1977, and an allocation based upon such production would be reasonable and would protect correlative rights.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(1) That for the month of February, 1977, the allowable production to be assigned the seventeen allocated gas pools in Lea, Eddy, Chaves, and Roosevelt Counties, New Mexico, is as follows:

(2) That the allocation hereby set for the month of February, 1977, in the seventeen allocated pools in Lea, Eddy, Chaves, and Roosevelt Counties, New Mexico, shall be in accordance with the Commission Rules, Regulations, and Orders.

(3) That a proration schedule, duly prepared by the Commission and thereafter adopted for the month of February, 1977, is hereto attached and made a part hereof; it distributes and allocates the allowable production among the gas wells in the seventeen gas pools listed above for the period stated, in accordance with the Commission Rules, Regulations, and Orders. -3-Order No. AG-41-11

The foregoing order shall remain effective until further order of the Commission.
