ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 o'clock a.m. on April 8, 1964, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner Daniel S. Nutter.

NOW, on this 28th day of April, 1964, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the testimony, the record, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

(1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.

(2) That the applicants, Cherry Brothers and Cabot Corporation, seek authority to complete their Austin State Well No. 1, located in Unit F of Section 19, Township 14 South, Range 36 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico, as a tubingless completion to produce oil from the Lower Wolfcamp formation through 2 7/8-inch casing set at approximately 10,513 feet with perforations from approximately 10,357 feet to 10,367 feet.

(3) That no pressure or corrosion problems should occur from the proposed completion.

(4) That the mechanics of the proposed completion are feasible and in accord with good conservation practices.

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(5) That approval of the subject application will prevent waste and protect correlative rights.


IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(1) That the applicants, Cherry Brothers and Cabot Corporation, are hereby authorized to complete their Austin State Well No. 1, located in Unit F of Section 19, Township 14 South, Range 36 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico, as a tubingless completion to produce oil from the Lower Wolfcamp formation through 2 7/8-inch casing set at approximately 10,513 feet with perforations from approximately 10,357 feet to 10,367 feet.

(2) That jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.


