THE APPLICATION OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION UPON ITS OWN MOTION FOR AN ORDER CREATING CERTAIN POOLS IN SAN JUAN COUNTY, NEW MEXICO.

ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 a.m. on February 15, 1967, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before the Oil Conservation Commission of New Mexico, hereinafter referred to as the "Commission."

NOW, on this <u>20th</u> day of February, 1967, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the testimony presented and the exhibits received at said hearing, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

(1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.

(2) That there is need for the creation of a new gas pool in San Juan County, New Mexico, for the production of gas from the Fruitland formation, said pool to bear the designation of Pinon-Fruitland Pool. Said Pinon-Fruitland Pool was discovered by Pan American Petroleum Corporation, Gallegos Canyon Unit Well No. 220, located in Unit I of Section 13, Township 28 North, Range 12 West, NMPM. It was completed in Fruitland on May 31, 1966. The top of the perforations is 1,242 feet.

(3) That there is need for the creation of a new gas pool in San Juan County, New Mexico, for the production of gas from the -2-CASE No. 3529 Order No. R-3196

Gallup formation, said pool to bear the designation of Ojo-Gallup Pool. Said Ojo-Gallup Pool was discovered by Exploration Drilling, Inc., Navajo Well No. 1, located in Unit D of Section 26, Township 28 North, Range 15 West, NMPM. It was completed in Gallup on November 9, 1961. The top of perforations is 4,524 feet.

(4) That there is need for the creation of a new oil pool in San Juan County, New Mexico, for the production of oil from the Dakota formation. Said pool to bear the designation of Slick Rock-Dakota Oil Pool. Said Slick Rock-Dakota Oil Pool was discovered by Claude C. Kennedy, Deb Well No. 2-X, located in Unit P of Section 36, Township 30 North, Range 17 West, NMPM. It was completed in Dakota on December 7, 1966. The top of perforations is 752 feet.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(a) That a new pool in San Juan County, New Mexico, classified as a gas pool for Fruitland production, is hereby created and designated as the Pinon-Fruitland Pool, consisting of the following-described area:

> TOWNSHIP 28 NORTH, RANGE 11 WEST, NMPM Section 18: NW/4

> TOWNSHIP 28 NORTH, RANGE 12 WEST, NMPM Section 13: N/2 and SE/4

(b) That a new pool in San Juan County, New Mexico, classified as a gas pool for Gallup production, is hereby created and designated as the Ojo-Gallup Pool, consisting of the followingdescribed area:

> TOWNSHIP 28 NORTH, RANGE 14 WEST, NMPM Section 31: S/2

> TOWNSHIP 28 NORTH, RANGE 15 WEST, NMPM Section 26: N/2 and SE/4 Section 35: NE/4 Section 36: N/2 and SE/4

(c) That a new pool in San Juan County, New Mexico, classified as an oil pool for Dakota production, is hereby created and -3-CASE No. 3529 Order No. R-3196

designated as the Slick Rock-Dakota Oil Pool, consisting of the following-described area:

TOWNSHIP 30 NORTH, RANGE 17 WEST, NMPM Section 36: S/2 SE/4

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That the effective date of this order and all creations included herein shall be March 1, 1967.
