THE APPLICATION OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION UPON ITS OWN MOTION FOR AN ORDER CHANGING THE DESIGNATED PRODUCING ZONE IN THE HOBBS POOL, LEA COUNTY, NEW MEXICO, FROM THE SAN ANDRES ZONE TO THE GRAYEURG-SAN ANDRES ZONE.

ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 o'clock on September 17, 1953, at Santa Fe, New Mexico before the Oil Conservation Commission, hereinafter referred to as the "Commission."

NOW, on this 15th day of October, 1953, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the testimony adduced, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

(1) That due notice having been given in compliance with law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause.

(2) That under authority of Rule 5, promulgated under Order No. 850, effective January 1, 1950, the Commission named, classified and defined certain oil and gas pools listed in Appendix 'A' of said rules.

(3) That among such listed pools was the Hobbs Oil Pool showing the producing formation to be the San Andres.

(4) That production experience and geological information have shown the producing formation of the pool to be the Grayburg-San Andres.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the name of the producing formation of the Hobbs Pool as set forth in Appendix 'A' of Order No. 850, effective January 1, 1950, be, and the same hereby is changed to read Grayburg-San Andres (G-SA).
