## ORDER OF THE DIVISION

## BY THE DIVISION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 a.m. on November 19, 1981, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner Richard L. Stamets.

NOW, on this <u>7th</u> day of January, 1982, the Division Director, having considered the testimony, the record, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised in the premises,

## FINDS:

(1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Division has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.

(2) That the applicant, Morris R. Antweil, seeks the promulgation of special rules for the West Nadine-Drinkard Pool, Lea County, New Mexico, including a special gas-oil limitation of 6,000 cubic feet of gas per barrel of oil.

(3) That the reservoir characteristics of the subject pool presently available justify the establishment of a gas-oil ratio limitation of 6,000 cubic feet of gas per barrel of liquid hydrocarbons.

(4) That in order to afford the owner of each property in the West Nadine-Drinkard Pool the opportunity to produce his just and equitable share of the oil and gas in the subject pool and for this purpose to use his just and equitable share of the reservoir energy, a limiting gas-oil ratio of 6,000 cubic feet of gas per barrel of liquid hydrocarbons should be established for the subject pool. -2-Case No. 7418 Order No. R-6848

## IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

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(1) That, effective December 1, 1981, Special Rules and Regulations for the West Nadine-Drinkard Pool, Lea County, New Mexico, are hereby promulgated as follows:

SPECIAL RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE WEST NADINE-DRINKARD POOL

RULE 1. That the limiting gas-oil ratio for said West Nadine-Drinkard Pool shall be 6,000 cubic feet of gas for each barrel of oil produced.

(2) That jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Division may deem necessary.
