Cause of Release: Appears to have been caused by an O-Ring failure on 6" liquid gathering line pig trap. The leak was found quickly and stopped. The original extent of the spill was incorrectly calculated/estimated. The volume of the spill was less than 5bbls based on the volume of the pig trap. All impacted soil was scrapped and removed. The area was also treated with Microblaze.
