Internal Oxy procedures ensure that upon a sudden and unexpected flaring event, production techs are promptly notified, and are instructed to assess the issue as soon as possible to take prompt corrective action and minimize emissions. Oxy production techs must assess and determine cause of flaring at its upstream facility. In this case, Lost Tank 18 CPF briefly flared due an unexpected malfunction with the valve to the pad inlet scrubber was stuck open for the gas lift, which in turn, triggered a flaring event to occur.

The only actions that Oxy can take is to minimize emissions as much as possible during these types of unexpected valve malfunction issues.
