Devon Energy Production Company (Devon) has contracted Pima Environmental Services, LLC (Pima) to perform a liner inspection and prepare this closure report for a produced water release that happened at the Belloq 11 CTB 1 (Belloq). This incident was assigned Incident ID:NAPP2406225921, by the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division (NMOCD).

Site Information and Site Characterization

The Belloq is located approximately Twenty-eight (28) miles southwest of Carlsbad, NM. This spill site is in Unit M, Section 11, Township 23S, Range 31E, Latitude 32.31470991 Longitude -103.7534005, Eddy County, NM. A Location Map can be found in Figure 1.

Based upon New Mexico Office of the State Engineer well water data, depth to the nearest groundwater in this area is 890 feet below grade surface (BGS). According to the United States Geological Survey well water data, depth to the nearest groundwater in this area is 100 feet BGS. See Appendix A for referenced water surveys. The Belloq is in a low karst area (Figure 3). A Topographic Map can be found in Figure 2.

Release Information

NAPP2406225921: On March 1, 2024, a connection broke on the strainer basket, the Unit was shut down to stop and isolate the leak. Approximately 50 barrels (bbls) of produced water were leased from the connection, into the lined, secondary containment. A vacuum truck was dispatched and recovered approximately 50 bbls of fluid from the lined SPCC containment ring. Once standing fluids were removed, the liner was visually inspected by Devon field staff for any pinholes or punctures; none were found. Based on this inspection there is no evidence that the spilled fluids left containment.

A Site Map can be found in Figure 4.

Site Assessment and Liner Inspection

On April 11, 2024, after submitting the 48-hour notification application ID:331339 to the OCD, Pima Environmental conducted a liner inspection at this location. Pima concluded that this liner and containment maintained its integrity and was able to retain the fluids. The liner inspection form and photographic documentation can be found in Appendix C.

Closure Request

After careful review, Pima requests that this incident ID: NAPP2406225921, be closed. Devon has complied with the applicable closure requirements.
