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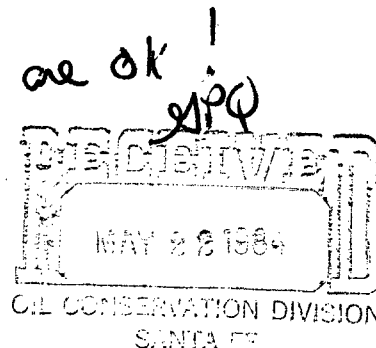

Dear Sir:

As per our telephone conversation on May 15, 1984, a check was made on the bottom hole pressures submitted on the application to commingle the above referenced well dated April 24, 1984.

A fluid level test was run May 18, 1984. This showed a BHP of 185 psi in the ~~Blinebry Zone~~. The bottom hole pressure in the Tubb-Drinkard is estimated from pressures in 1964 when a CIBP was set over this zone. BHP then was 200 psi (fluid level and packer leakage test).

You also mentioned needing an order number on the dual completion. Our files are incomplete and all I found was that the operator at the time was Cactus Drilling Company and the well was dually completed in April, 1962. I'm sorry I can't be of any more help.

I'm sorry I wasn't more accurate on the Blinebry Zone pressure before. As I stated, the Tubb-Drinkard is more of an estimate, since it was abandoned in 1964.

If I can be of further help, please let me know.
