You have requested to drill this well at an unorthodox oil well location described above in the referenced pool or formation. This location is governed by statewide Rule 15.9.A [19.15.15.9.A NMAC], which provides for 40-acre units with wells located at least 330 feet from a unit outer boundary. This location is less than 330 feet from a unit outer boundary, based on preliminary directional survey.

Your application has been duly filed under the provisions of Division Rules [19.15.15.13 NMAC] and [19.15.4.12.A(2) NMAC].

It is our understanding that you are seeking this location due to land uses.

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It is also understood that notice of this application to offsetting operators or owners is unnecessary due to common ownership.

Pursuant to the authority conferred by Division Rule [19.15.15.13 NMAC], the above-described unorthodox location is hereby approved.
