Reference is made to your application received on June 11, 2014.

You have requested to drill this well at a non-standard oil spacing and proration unit described above in the referenced pool or formation. This proration unit is governed by statewide Rule 19.15.15.9.A NMAC, which provides for 40-acre units, with wells located at least 330 feet from a unit outer boundary, and Rule 19.15.16.14.B(2) NMAC concerning directional wells in designated project areas. This location is unorthodox because a portion of the project area is non-standard.

Statewide Rule 19.15.15.9.A NMAC provides for 40-acre units, which consists of the entire project area except Lot 4 of Section 33. Lot 4 of Section 33 is comprised of 24.74-acres. According to Division Rule 19.15.15.11.B(1) NMAC, an administrative approval is required for a non-standard spacing unit that is less than 70 percent of a standard spacing unit, in this case 24.74 acres.

Your application has been duly filed under the provisions of Division Rules 19.15.15.13 NMAC and 19.15.4.12.A(2) NMAC.

It is our understanding that you are seeking this location because the non-standard project area represents a reasonable and effective method by which portions of Irregular Section 33 can be incorporated into horizontal Bone Spring project area.

It is also understood that since no acreage is being excluded in the project area, no interest owner is affected; therefore, notification is not required.

Pursuant to the authority conferred by Division Rule 19.15.15.13 (B) NMAC, the above-described unorthodox location is hereby approved.

The above approvals are subject to your being in compliance with all other applicable Division rules, including, but not limited to Division Rule 19.15.5.9 NMAC.

Jurisdiction of this case is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Division may deem necessary.
