Pursuant to your application received on September 22, 2017, BOPCO, L.P. (OGRID 260737) is hereby authorized to surface commingle oil and gas production from diversely owned leases in the form of federal leases and federal communitization agreements from the following pools located in Township 25 South, Range 30 East, NMPM, Eddy County, New Mexico.

The combined project area for these wells includes the E/2 SE/4 Section 8, E/2 E/2 of Section 17, E/2 E/2 and W/2 of Section 20, W/2 W/2 of Section 21, and the W/2 of Section 29, all in Township 25 South, Range 30 East, NMPM, Eddy County, New Mexico.

The commingled oil and gas production from the wells detailed above shall be measured and sold at the Poker Lake Unit Pierce Canyon 17 Central Tank Battery (CTB) located in Unit P, Section 17, Township 25 South, Range 30 East, Lea County, New Mexico.

Production from the subject wells shall be determined as follows:

The Poker Lake CVX JV PC Well No. 21H and the Poker Lake Unit Well No. 464H shall be measured separately before comingling.

The remaining wells, the Poker Lake Unit CV JV PC Well No. 1H, Poker Lake Unit CVX JV RR Well No. 10H, and Poker Lake CVX JV RR Well No. 6H (Poker Lake Wells) shall be measured with a combination of metering and well testing. It is understood that the test separator and meters are designed to accurately measure production from the wells with the highest production rate. It is also assumed that all of the oil and gas production from the wells in this application will display a hyperbolic decline, and will fit the decline parameters described in Hearing Order R-14299. The Poker Lake Wells are presently in Range 3 of decline and shall be measured with a combination of metering and well testing, and shall be tested at least once a month.

The allocation meters shall be calibrated quarterly in accordance with Rule 19.15.12.10.C (2) NMAC.

After initial notification, future wells that will produce from the pools and leases approved by this order may be added to this commingling authority by submittal of a Sundry Notice to the Engineering Bureau in Santa Fe.


Your application has been duly filed under the provisions of Division Rule 19.15.4.12.A (8) NMAC.
