Describe Area Affected and Cleanup Action Taken.\* The lease operator was contacted at 3:45 am by the night watchmen at the Ross Ranch SWD. The gun barrel on location was overflowing and spraying fluid. It was discovered that the dump on free water knockout at the Snapping 2 State #7 had hung open and sent all fluid and gas to the Ross Ranch SWD. The equipment malfunction caused an abnormal amount of fluids to transfer to the gun barrel, causing the tank to run over releasing 100bbls of produced water in a lined containment. The operator notified the foreman and was instructed to dispatch a vacuum truck to recover all fluids that were displaced and make arrangements to clean the tanks and containment.
