AMENDED Administrative Order NSP-1809 (L) (SD)

Dear Mr. Keathly:

At the request of Raptor Resources, Inc., by letter dated March 21, 2000, Division Administrative Order NSP-1809 (L) (SD), dated October 12, 1999, shall be amended by deleting the State "A" A/C-1 Well No. 43 (API No. 30-025-09236), located 660 feet from the South and West lines (Unit M) of Section 3, Township 23 South, Range 36 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico, from the provisions of this order. Therefore, the 280-acre non-standard gas spacing and proration unit ("GPU") consisting of the N/2 SW/4, SW/4 SW/4, and SE/4 of Section 3, which was established by this order, will now be simultaneously dedicated to the following described wells:

- State "A" A/C-1Well No. 30 (API No. 30-025-09238), located at an unorthodox gas well location for the subject 280-acre GPU 1650 feet from the South line and 990 feet from the East line (Unit I) of Section 3;
- (2) State "A" A/C-1 Well No. 35 (API No. 30-025-09237), located at a standard gas well location for this 280-acre GPU 1650 feet from the South line and 990 feet from the West line (Unit L) of Section 3;
- (3) State "A" A/C-1 Well No. 61 (API No. 30-025-09232), located at a standard gas well location for this 280-acre GPU 1980 feet from the South and East lines (Unit J) of Section 3;
- (4) State "A" A/C-1 Well No. 64 (API No. 30-025-09230), located at a standard gas well location for this 280-acre GPU 710 feet from the South line and 1980 feet from the East line (Unit O) of Section 3; and
- (5) State "A" A/C-1 Well No. 69 (API No. 30-025-09229), located at a standard gas well location for this 280-acre GPU 660 feet from the South line and 990 feet from the East line

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(Unit P) of Section 3.

By this amendment Raptor is authorized to simultaneously dedicate Jalmat gas production from all five of the above described wells and will be permitted to produce the allowable assigned the subject 280-acre GPU from all five wells in any proportion.

All other provisions of Division Administrative Order NSP-1809 (L) (SD) shall remain in full force and affect until further notice.

Jurisdiction of this case is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Division may deem necessary
