Dear Ms. Staley:

We have reviewed your application to commingle production downhole from the Otero Chacra, Blanco Mesaverde and the Basin Dakota Pools in the following well:

Florance #66 1060' FSL, 1710' FEL, Section 18, T-27N, R-8W San Juan County, New Mexico

The acreage dedicated to this well contains portions of Federal Lease NM-03380. Your intent to allocate based on fixed percentages would not be equitable because the Dakota formation has been producing for several years and the Chacra and Mesaverde formations will be new completions. Approved allocation factors are: (Natural Gas) Basin Dakota volumes based on extrapolated historical production with the remainder of the gas produced each month allocated 80% to the Mesaverde and 20% to the Chacra(based on data furnished from offset production). (Condensate) Basin Dakota volumes based on the percentage of gas allocated with the remainder of the condensate allocated to the Mesaverde. There will be no condensate allocation to the Chacra pool since offset Chacra producers have demonstrated that no liquids are associated with gas production from the Chacra producers in the area.
