Energen Resources Corporation (Energen) hereby requests Administrative Approval for an Unorthodox Location of its Jicarilla 117E #9B Mesaverde Well under the provisions of New Mexico Oil Conservation Division (NMOCD) set back provisions.

This well is located 2515' FNL and 565' FWL of Section 33-T26N-R3W, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico and is dedicated to a spacing unit consisting of the W/2 of Section 33, in the Blanco Mesaverde gas pools.

This well is located closer than 660' from the western proration unit boundary by 95'. This is due to the location being moved westward by the Jicarilla Apache Tribe in order to remove it from a ridge and not to impact wildlife. 

WELL LOCATION AND ACREAGE DEDICATION PLAT







This letter is in response to an On-Site conducted for Energen Resources Corporation, on September 17, 2003. This includes comments made by the participants for mitigation of the requests for an Application for Permit to Drill. General stipulations to include:

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- 1. Line reserve pit with a 15 Mil liner.
- 2. Enclose Reserve Pit and Flare Pit with a proper fence.
- 3. The locations will require that the topsoil be stockpiled for re-contouring and restoring the surface after the reserve pit is closed.
- 4. Production equipment will be painted dark green to minimize visual impact.
- 5. Reseed with a suitable southwest mix, containing native species as well as quick growing grass varieties-contact the Game and Fish, Tom Watts for a suitable recommendation.
- 6. Construct Blow Pit to minimize overflow spray, i.e., higher walls.
- 7. Wood shall be cut and taken to the Tribal Services in Dulce.

The locations reviewed Primary plants include native grasses, sagebrush, Juniper and Pinyon stands, to oak brush, Mountain Mahogany, and Ponderosa Pine. Individual comments for the wells reviewed:

Jicarilla 98-2C The proposed well is adjacent to State Highway 537, in sandy soil, with sagebrush, native grasses. There is a drainage on the south side of the proposed location, and it is recommended that a berm be put in place on the south side of the location. This wash is evident on the NCE survey enclosed. A pond is proposed in a southwest direction to minimize erosion to the well site. A cattleguard is recommended for installation, and Doug Thomas has indicated that if traffic is being attracted to the site, an additional gate may be required to deter public use of the location for parking, littering, or other undesirable events. No pipeline plats were provided for this well site.

Jicarilla 98-4R The proposed well is located on primarily sandstone adjacent to an existing road, in Pinyon and juniper surroundings. The well is acceptable for development and poses minimal impact. No pipeline plats were provided for this well site.

Jicarilla 117E #9B The site is unacceptable as the proposed well site is on a ridge in an area, which will impact wildlife. The recommendation is to move the location westward from the proposed site into an area where the well pipeline tie-in would also prove less damaging. There is an existing well in the proximity to make the proper tie-ins.

Jicarilla 117E #3B The well is situated on an East-facing slope containing excessive Pinyon and juniper growth. The access road crosses a low area which the On-Site participants propose building a pond to minimize the water accumulation, which will result from trucks crossing the sagebrush flats. Two culverts, twenty-four inches in diameter will be placed on the constructed berm, which will serve double duty as a part of the access road and part of the pond created for containing water. Pipeline length is 1254.0'.

Jicarilla 98 3C The well site is situated in Pinyon and Juniper stands, sandy loamy soil. The location should be rounded at C' adjacent to the road to accommodate the road right of way. Install an eighteen-inch (18") culvert on the access adjacent to the road. No pipeline plats were provided for this well site.

Jicarilla 94 5C This well site is to be moved north approximately 150 feet and the on-site reviewed at a future date.

Jicarilla 95 5C The well site is on a north facing slope, pine trees, oak, pinyon/juniper, sandy/loamy soil. The access is on an existing pipeline. Mitigation will include the placement of two water bars above the tie-in and on the road below to remove water from the access road. The road is currently partially washed out. Pipeline tie-in is 646.1'.

The Oil and Gas Administration hereby recommends approval of Jicarilla 98-2C, Jicarilla 98-4R, Jicarilla 117E #3B, Jicarilla 98 3C, Jicarilla 95 5C, accompanying pipeline where pipeline plats are provided, with mitigation and stipulations proposed.

Issues which the Oil and Gas Administration would like for the Bureau of Land Management Engineering to consider is the impact of surface casing and consider the impact of water sources in areas of the Jicarilla Apache Reservation. A recommendation from the interdisciplinary group comprised of the Jicarilla Apache Departments participating in the On-Site process recommended increasing surface casing to 500'. The Oil and Gas would like a response from the Bureau of Land Management, in regards to impacts of water in the Lindrith area; as we may be placing the Jicarilla Apache Nation in a situation of liability in regards to our oil and gas drilling.

The participants to the On-Site further recommend that damages not be assessed to ponds created to mitigate impacts to wildlife, to minimize impact due to erosion, or to improve access to a wellsite. Damage fees to other right-of-ways will continue to be assessed at a rate, which will be addressed in a separate letter.

Our approval took into consideration our obligations to the Jicarilla Apache Nation to promote prudent development of the Nations' Oil and Gas reserves. If you have any questions please call me at 759-3485, extension 30.
