Cimarex Energy Co. of Colorado (OGRID 162683) is hereby authorized to surface commingle oil and gas production from Quail Ridge; Bone Spring, South Pool (50461) from the following leases and wells:

Lease: Communization Agreement Chaparral 33 Federal Com 3H

Description: E/2 E/2 of Section 33, Township 19 South, Range 34 East, NMPM

Wells: Chaparral 33 Federal Com. Well No. 3H

Lease: Pending Communization Agreement Chaparral 33 Federal Com 4H

Description: W/2 E/2 of Section 33, Township 19 South, Range 34 East, NMPM

Well: Chaparral 33 Federal Com. Well No. 4H

Lease: Pending Communization Agreement Chaparral 33 Federal Com 5H

Description: E/2 W/2 of Section 33, Township 19 South, Range 34 East, NMPM

Well: Chaparral 33 Federal Com. Well No. 5H

The combined project area for these wells include the E/2 and E/2 W/2 of Section 33, Township 19 South, Range 34 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico.

The commingled oil and gas production from the wells detailed above shall be measured and sold at the Chaparral 33 Federal Com. Well No. 3H Central Tank Battery (CTB), located in Unit A, Section 33, Township 19 South, Range 34 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico.

Production from the subject wells shall be determined as follows:

The oil and gas production from each of the diversely-owned leases shall be separately metered using allocation meters.

The allocation meters shall be calibrated quarterly in accordance with Rule 19.15.12.10.C (2).

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Subsequently drilled wells that produce from the subject pool within the project areas approved by this order may be added to this commingling authority by submittal of a Sundry Notice to the Engineering Bureau in Santa Fe.

This installation shall be installed and operated in accordance with the applicable Division Rules. It is the responsibility of the producer to notify the transporter of this commingling authority.

This approval is subject to like approval from the Bureau of Land Management before commencing commingling operations.

The operator shall notify the Hobbs District office of the Division prior to implementation of the commingling operations.
