Wells were shut in until the facility was repaired. Describe Area Affected and Cleanup Action Taken.* A vacuum truck removed the standing fluid in the containment (mainly fresh water sprayed by the fire department) and hauled to disposal. The charred gravel was removed and hauled to disposal. The heater treater was replaced by a used heater treater and the production lines replaced. Facility is back in service. Crystal, please find attached the C-141 form for the Jeffers Heater Treater fire. As discussed, a hole in the fire tube ignited the oil in the heater treater causing the heater treater to burn and associated piping. All damaged equipment was inside of the containment and oil was burned. The foreman removed the charred gravel and hauled to disposal and used a vacuum truck to remove the fresh water sprayed by the fire department and the produced water remaining in the heater treater and free water knockout to disposal. He brought in new gravel, installed a used heater treater and associated piping. The facility is back in service.

Also, I confirmed with our foreman his trip to the Horse Creek Com #2 scheduled for Monday. As soon as he supplies us with accurate information, I will finish completing the C-141.
