The combined project area for these wells include the W/2 of Section 3, and entire Section 10, Township 24 South, Range 33 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico.

The commingled oil and gas production from the wells detailed above shall be measured and sold at the Neptune 10 Central Tank Battery (CTB) located in Unit K, Section 10, Township 24 South, Range 33 East, Lea County, New Mexico.

Production from the subject wells shall be determined as follows:

The oil and gas production from each of the diversely-owned leases shall be measured with allocation meters.

The oil and gas production from each well will flow into a dedicated 3-phase separator. The production stream will be separated into 3 independent streams by the separator and each stream will be measured individually after it exits the separator, before commingling.

The allocation meters shall be calibrated quarterly in accordance with Rule 19.15.12.10.C (2) NMAC.

Your application has been duly filed under the provisions of Division Rules 19.15.12.10 C (4) NMAC and 19.15.4.12.A (8) NMAC. However, the affected party signed a waiver, consenting to the administrative surface commingle application.

The operator shall notify the transporter of this commingling authority.

This Order supersedes Administrative Order CTB-759, issued on August 10, 2015. This Order includes both the Bone Spring and the Wolfcamp formations, diverse ownership, and change in the entire project area.

The operator shall notify the Hobbs District Office upon commencement of commingling operations.

This approval is subject to like approval from the New Mexico State Land Office before commencing commingling operations.
