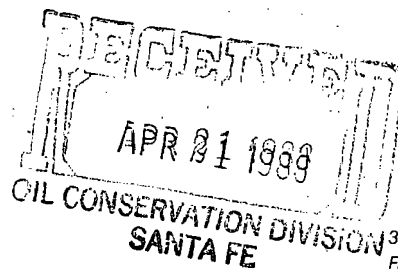

Dear Mr. LeMay:

Union Texas Petroleum (UTP) requests administrative approval to intentionally deviate a well from vertical. UTP desires to place the Payne 4E at a surface location of 1820' FNL and 170' FWL of Section 23, T32N-R10W. This location will be on Federal surface with operators of record being Tenneco Oil Company and El Paso Natural Gas Company. A R-O-W grant from the BLM is currently in progress. This R-O-W will give UTP the right to occupy this land for the purpose of drilling, completing, operating, and producing this well.

UTP intends to directionally drill the Payne 4E from the aforementioned surface location to a bottomhole location of 1650' FNL and 1850' FEL of Section 22, T32N-R10W. This is a legal location.

UTP requests this approval for the following reason. The well was initially planned to be drilled straight at the location referenced above. After lengthy discussions with the surface landowner, UTP could not come to terms for a surface damage agreement. This proration unit is not reasonably accessible from any direction except from the existing roads through this proration unit. Inasmuch as we are unable to come to terms with the landowner, who controls access to these roads, we are left with no other choice than to directionally drill this well.

UTP believes that by granting approval to intentionally deviate this well from vertical it will prevent waste by allowing UTP to produce a well which may never be drilled if the approval is not granted. In addition, UTP believes that all correlative rights will be protected by granting this application.

Pursuant to Rule 111-(d), UTP realizes that an acceptable bottomhole location will not be farther than 50' away from the proposed bottomhole location of 1650' FNL and 1850' FEL, Section 22, T32N-R10W. Pursuant to Rule 111-(e), UTP has notified the offsetting proration unit operators of our intentions. The operators were notified by certified mail as of this date, a copy of which is attached for your review.

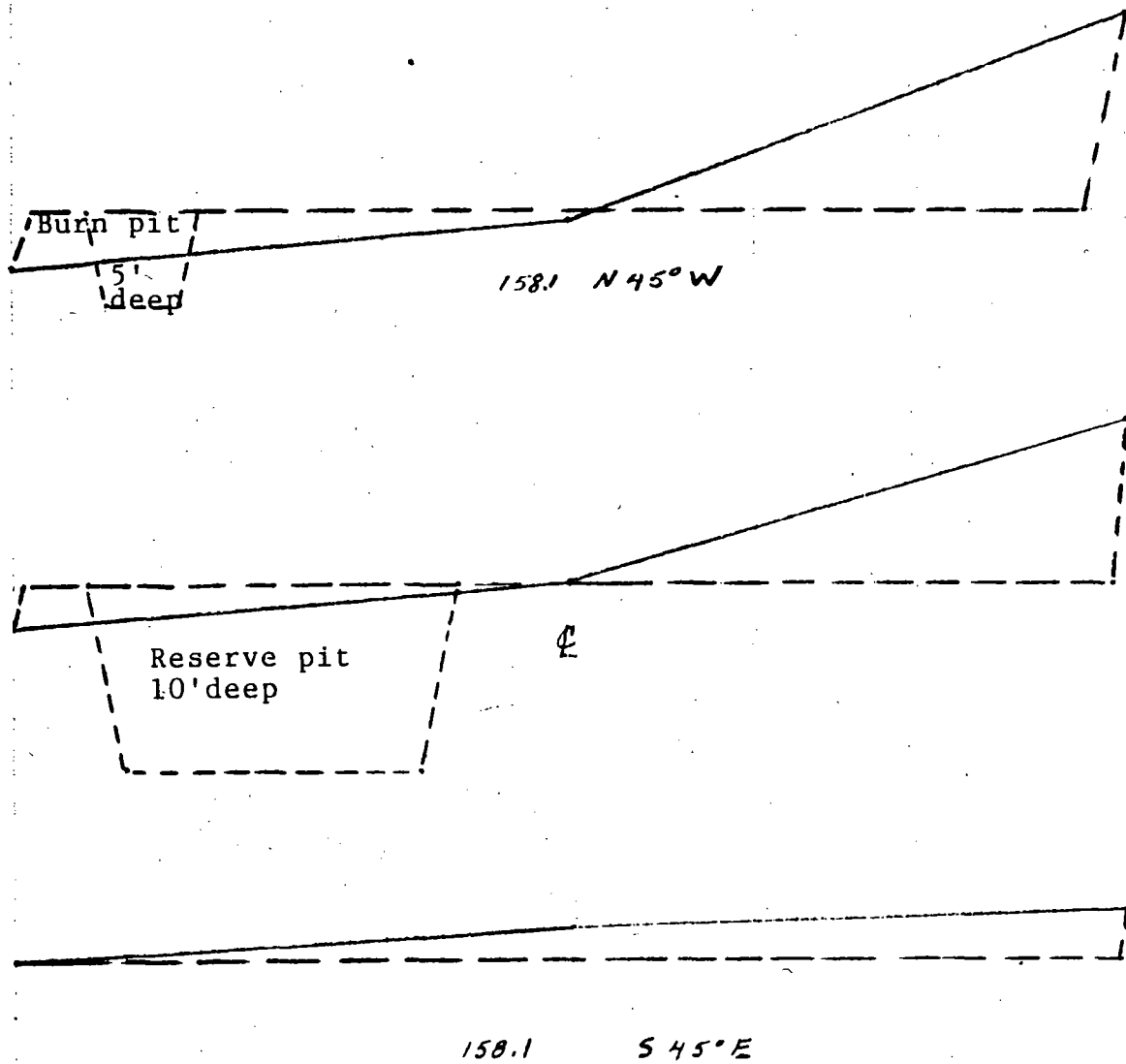
