Gentlemen:

Amerada Petroleum Corporation is presently drilling its J. Apache "B" No. 9 well located 990' FNL and 990' FEL of Section 20-24N-5W, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico.

We propose to run 3-1/2" OD (2.992 ID) casing to total depth, approximately 6820, and perforate for Basin Dakota gas production. All known producing horizons will be protected by cement. A staging tool (DV colar) will be run just below the Pictured Cliffs formation to insure its protection. The Gallup formation was tested and found unproductive.

We do not intend to run a string of tubing, therefore, respectfully request an exception to statewide rule 107 (d)-(2) be granted.
