Dear Mr. Herritt:

Reference is made to the following: (i) your application dated July 14, 2006 (*administrative application reference No. pMES0-626152081*); and (ii) the records of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division ("Division") in Aztec and Santa Fe, New Mexico: all concerning Huntington Energy, L.L.C.'s ("Huntington") request for an exception to the well location requirements provided within the "*Special Rules and Regulations for the Basin-Dakota Pool*," as promulgated by Division Order No. R-10987-B, dated June 30, 2000, as amended by Division Orders No. R-10987-B (1), dated August 10, 2000, and R-10987-B (2), dated January 29, 2002, for Huntington's Canyon Largo Unit Well No. 464 (*API No. 30-039-27871*), drilled earlier this year at an unorthodox gas well location 1330 feet from the South line and 2595 feet from the East line (Unit J) of Section 15, Township 25 North, Range 7 West, NMPM, Basin-Dakota Pool (*71629*), Rio Arriba County, New Mexico.


The E/2 of Section 15, being a standard 320-acre stand-up gas spacing and proration unit in the Basin-Dakota Pool, is to be dedicated to this well.

Your application has been duly filed under the provisions of Division Rules 104.F and 605.B and the applicable rules governing the Basin-Dakota Pool.

By the authority granted me under the applicable provisions of the special pool rules governing the Basin-Dakota Pool and Division Rule 104.F (2), the above-described unorthodox Dakota gas well location for the Canyon Largo Unit Well No. 464, is hereby approved:

Further, the aforementioned well and spacing unit will be subject to all existing rules, regulations, policies, and procedures applicable to prorated gas pools in Northwest, New Mexico.
