As the enclosed map shows, these proposed injection wells are necessitated by the fact that wells I-14 and I-15 (now re-numbered #25 and #26 Santa Fe, respectively) both proved to be oil-productive.

The proposed wells are intended to extend the producing area of the pool, and to join in a pattern which will result in a thorough and efficient sweep of the oil by the water flood.

The correlative rights of other owners are not involved in the proposed expansion of the water flood area.
