## APPLICATION

- 1. Texaco, Inc. is the mineral lessee of that certain property located in the No of Section 15, Township 28 North, Range 13 West, N.M.P.M., San Juan County, New Mexico, containing 320 acres. Texaco plans to begin in the near future drilling a gas well whose objective horizon is the Dakota gas pool.
- 2. Due to extremely rough terrain, it will be impossible for the applicant to drill said well at the orthodox location, to wit: 790 feet from the boundary line of the proration unit and no nearer than 130 feet to a Governmental quarter quarter section line or subdivision inner boundary line. The closest location to said orthodox location where the terrain permits drilling is 1,122 feet from the north line and 220 feet from the east line of Section 15, Township 28 North, Range 13 West, N.M.P.M., San Juan County, New Mexico.
- 3. Applicant shows the Commission that prior to this application, Applicant had applied for administrative approval for another unorthodox location which approval was granted under Administrative Order NSI-343 on February 22, 1965.
