



## ABSTRACT

New Mexico Archaeological Services, Inc., representing YATES PETROLEUM CORPORATION, Artesia, undertook an archaeological reconnaissance of Bureau of Land Management lands scheduled to be impacted by the construction of a drill location. The proposed work will be situated in Section 6, T7S, R26E, NMPM, Chaves County, New Mexico. Cultural properties consist of one archaeological site (NMAS 5526). NMAS is <u>suggesting</u> clearance for YATES PETROLEUM CORPORATION's proposed work.

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## Introduction

On 7 June 1983, New Mexico Archaeological Services, Inc., (NMAS), Carlsbad, undertook for YATES PETROLEUM CORPORATION, Artesia, an archaeological reconnaissance of federal lands administered by the Bureau of Land Management in Chaves County, New Mexico. The reconnoitered area will be impacted by the construction of a drill location. This project was advanced by Mr. Ken Beardemphl, Regulatory Agent, YATES PETROLEUM CORPORATION, and administered by Dr. J. Loring Haskell, Principal Investigator, NMAS, Inc. This reconnaissance was undertaken by Dr. Haskell.

## Survey Technique

For this investigation, YATES PETROLEUM CORPORATION's proposed location was reconnoitered for evidence of man's past activities by walking it in a series of 25 ft wide, close interval (15° or less), zigzag transects. In addition, an added zone embracing to 20 ft on each side of the staked 400 X 400 ft location and lying outside the bounds of the proposed work area, was reconnoitered by a similar means. Methodologically, this procedure served to promote optimal conditions for the visual examination of areas to be impacted by constructionrelated activities.

## Location

The proposed location will measure 400 X 400 ft (Actual Area Surveyed 4.44 Acres) on federal lands and will be situated 2248 ft from the south line and 1989 ft from the east line of:

## Terrain

YATES PETROLEUM CORPORATION'S proposed work will be situated on the north-facing shoulder of a low ridge lying due south of Fivemile Draw and west of the Pecos River flood plain. Locally, this landform is distinguished by a continuous system of minor hummocks with microrelief averaging 0.25 m. Hummocks are separated by denuded areas which are subject to the effects of ephemeral sheetwash. Rills and some gullying are characteristic of these places. Immediately to the north and to a lesser extent to the east these features are more pronounced owing to increased gradient. Soil individuals, composed of clay loams, silty clay loams and sandy clay loams, commonly harbor gravel-sized inclusions with cobble-sized quartzites increasing in frequency toward the north end east.

#### Floristics

Principal components of the floral community's overstory are <u>Prosopis juliflora</u> and <u>Atriplex canescens</u>. Attendant forbs are <u>Croton</u> sp., <u>Perezia nana</u>, <u>Dyssodia sp., Zinnia acerosa</u>, <u>Mentzelia sp.</u>, and <u>Euphorbia sp.</u> The Gramineae is represented in the immediate vicinity by <u>Bouteloua sp.</u>, <u>Hilaria mutica</u>, <u>Muhlenbergia porterii</u>, and <u>Tridens</u> pulchellus.

## Cultural Resources

During the course of this reconnaissance, one archaeological site (NMAS 5526) was recorded.

Nature of Cultural Resources: NMAS 5526, a large occupation zone,

is situated on the upper slope of a low ridge which serves to demarcate the southern edge of Fivemile Draw. Locally, this landform is subject to intense sheetwash. Erosional activity has exposed screes of quartzite cobbles which occur principally in and near gullies. Resources, occurring in the form of a light and extensive lithic scatter, are situated mainly to runoff. For these resources, many of the observed remains have been rolled. Cultural properties, mostly derived from quartzite, include primary decortication flakes, secondary decortication flakes, thinning flakes, occasional unprepared cores, hammerstones, and tabular flakes. Additionally, one highly eroded fire hearts composed of heat-fractured quartzite cobbles was noted. No diagnostic artifacts were observed. Many of the 15, quartzite primary- and secondary-decortication flakes do evidence signs of retouch. While present, artifactual remains derived from chert are not particularly common. NMAS 5526 has been impacted by the construction of the existing county road.

Further work at this site should focus on methods of flakedtool manufacture and the overall make up of the occupation zone. 3

in terms of discrete sets of work-related activities. Owing to its location next to the Orchard Park Terrace, diagnostic type artifacts may be present, i.e., possibly a potsherd, or two, or even a projectile point.

## Recommendations


NMAS <u>suggests</u> clearance for YATES PETROLEUM CORPORATION's proposed location <u>provided</u> NMAS 5526 is <u>avoided</u>. Whereas YATES' proposed pad will measure 230 X 230 ft,its presence should not pose a problem. <u>Work-related activities and vehicular traffic</u>, <u>however</u>, <u>should be</u> <u>confined to the area west of the transmission line</u>. If <u>additional</u> cultural properties are encountered during construction, the BLM and NMAS should be notified immediately. <u>Men and materiel are to avoid the</u> <u>archaeologically sensitive area</u>. Clearance, of course, is granted by the Bureau of Land Management.


