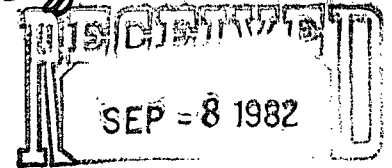

Dear Sirs:

Joel Burr, Jr. seeks permission for an unorthodox location of his No. 1 Country Club at 1420' FNL and 730' FEL, Sec 30, T30N, R12W, San Juan County, New Mexico. This location is needed to take advantage of an existing well pad, and also avoid production equipment on that pad. The site is within the city limits of Farmington, New Mexico and is located about 250' northeast of a fairway at San Juan Country Club. Moving the site to a standard location in its present quarter-quarter would conflict with the golf course or a planned sub-division (see attached sub-division plan).

The undersigned seeks permission for an unorthodox location of his No. 1 Country Club well located 1420' FNL and 730' FEL, Section 30, T30N, R12W, N.M.P.M., San Juan County, New Mexico.

Your files will reflect that you have previously granted an unorthodox location for this well as it applies to the Pictured Cliff Formation underlying said well site. Your records will also reflect that a bridge plug was set above the Pictured Cliff Formation at a depth of 1765' so that operator could test the Fruitland Formation with perforations from 1352' to 1360'. This well is currently capable of producing from the Fruitland Formation.


