Dear Mr. Catanach:

Ensource, Inc. is applying for administrative approval of an unorthodox well location for the above captioned well under the provisions of paragraph F of rule 104 of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission Rules and Regulations.

Standard field rules require that the well location be no closer than 330 feet to any 40 acre boundry. Because of terrain problems it is extremely difficult to locate a well in this quarter section. The Sand Creek draw cuts through the quarter in the most desirable standard locations. The location selected would have been all right as far as the surface problems go, but the Southwestern Public Service Co. main powerline is crossing this part of the quarter section and requires at least a 150 foot clearance for safety reasons by SPS Co.

This entire section is a single Federal lease (No. NM-29621) to Donald G. Stevens, with a farmout to Ensource, Inc. Since this is an interior forty surrounded by the same lease, it is requested that an administrative approval be given without the waiver requirement from adjoining leases. No encroachment is being made to adjoining leases. An APD has been submitted to BLM for approval and a field inspection was made by them, with no objection to the location.
