Dear Ms. Bradfield:

Reference is made to your application dated May 4, 1993 for an unorthodox Blanco-Mesaverde gas well location on an existing standard 320-acre gas spacing and proration unit (GPU) for said Blanco-Mesaverde Pool comprising the W/2 of Section 26, Township 30 North, Range 7 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico. Said GPU presently has dedicated thereon the San Juan 30-6 Unit Well Nos. 95-A and 95-R located in Units D and M, respectively, of said Section 26.

By the authority granted me under the provisions of Rule 2(d) of the Special Rules and Regulations for the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool, as promulgated by Division Order No. R-8170, as amended, the following described well to be drilled at an unorthodox gas well location is hereby approved:

San Juan 30-6 Unit Well No. 95-X 640' FSL - 1520' FWL (Unit N)

Further, Meridian is authorized to simultaneously dedicate Blanco-Mesaverde gas production on the subject GPU from the No. 95-X well with the two existing Well Nos. 95-A and 95-R. Said wells and GPU will be subject to all existing rules, regulations, policies, and procedures applicable to prorated gas pools in Northwest New Mexico.
